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## SAFETY INSTRUCTION

Please carefully read the following safety instruction so as to avoid personal injuries and prevent the equipment and other connection devices from being damaged.

1. Power sources (note: please use the power supply attached or specified by the manufacturer)

Never operate the equipment by using unspecified power supply.

2. Never push objects of any kind through openings of DVR so as to avoid electric shock or other accidents.

3. Do not put the equipment in the dusty field

4. Do not place the equipment under rain or humid environment. If the equipment is accidentally in contact with water, please unplug the power cable and immediately contact your local dealer.

5. Keep the surface of the equipment clean and dry. Use soft damp cloth to clean the outer case of DVR (do not use liquid aerosol cleaners)

6. Do not operate if any problems are found. If there are any strange smell or sound from DVR, unplug the power cable and contact the authorized dealer or service center.

7. Do not try to remove the upper cover

Warning: Do not remove the cap of DVR so as to avoid electric shock.

8. Handle with care

If DVR does not work normally because of hitting on the hard object, please contact the authorized dealer for repair or replacement.

9. Use standard lithium battery (Note: Use the batteries attached or specified by the manufacturer)

After cutting off the power supply, if the system clock cannot continue to work, please replace the standard 3V lithium battery on the main board.

Warning: Turn off DVR before replacing the batteries, or you may be suffered from serious electric shock. Please properly dispose of the used batteries.

10. Put the equipment in a place with good ventilation

The DVR system includes HDD, which produces large amount of heat during operation. As a result, do not block the ventilation openings (on the top, bottom, both sides and the reverse side) for cooling the system during operation. Install or put the equipment in the place with good ventilation.

11. The attached power adapter can only be used for 1 set of DVR. Do not connect more equipment, or DVR may be restarted repeatedly because of insufficient power.

12. Prevent the equipment from water dropping or splashing. Do not place objects containing water, such as flower vase, on the equipment.

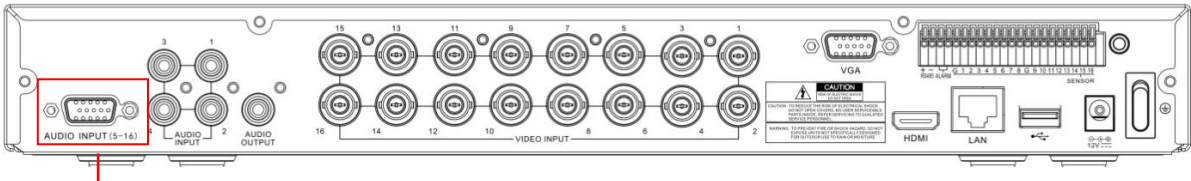

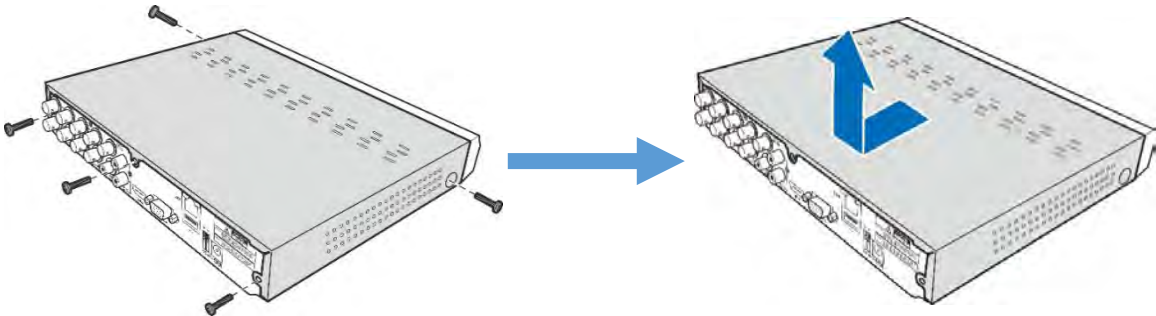
2.1 HDD Installation

Depending on the package you have purchased, the hard disk drive may be included in the full package. If it is not pre-installed, follow the installation instructions on this user manual.

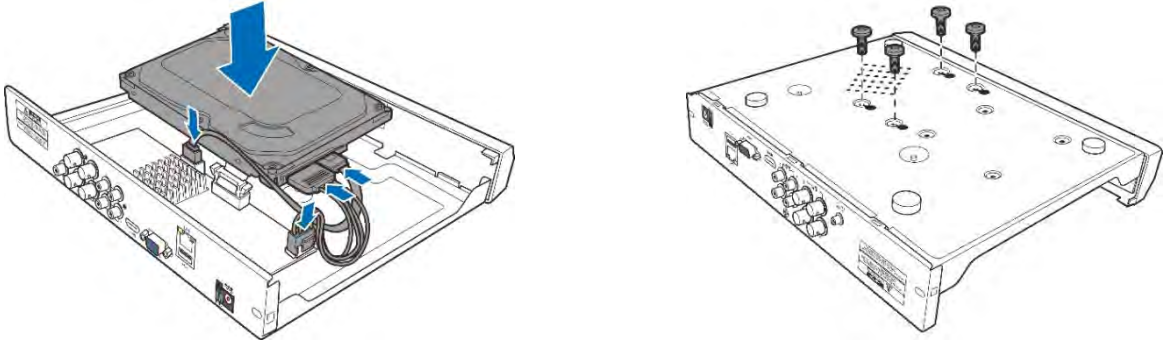
**Caution:** DO NOT install or remove the hard disk drive while the device power is turned ON.

HDD Installation:

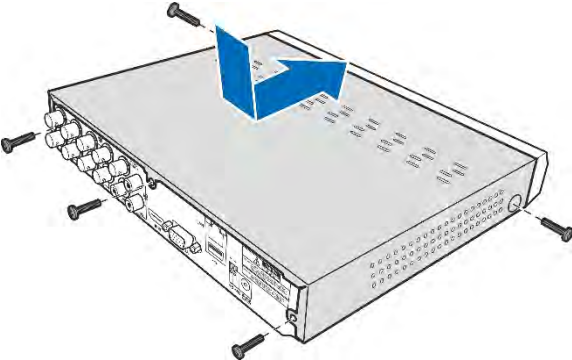
- (1) Cut power firstly, and then remove screws on both sides & rear panel, and open DVR upper cover.



(2) Connect the data and power cables to the HDD and place the HDD on the DVR case. Carefully flip the DVR case and secure the HDD to the DVR with the screws.

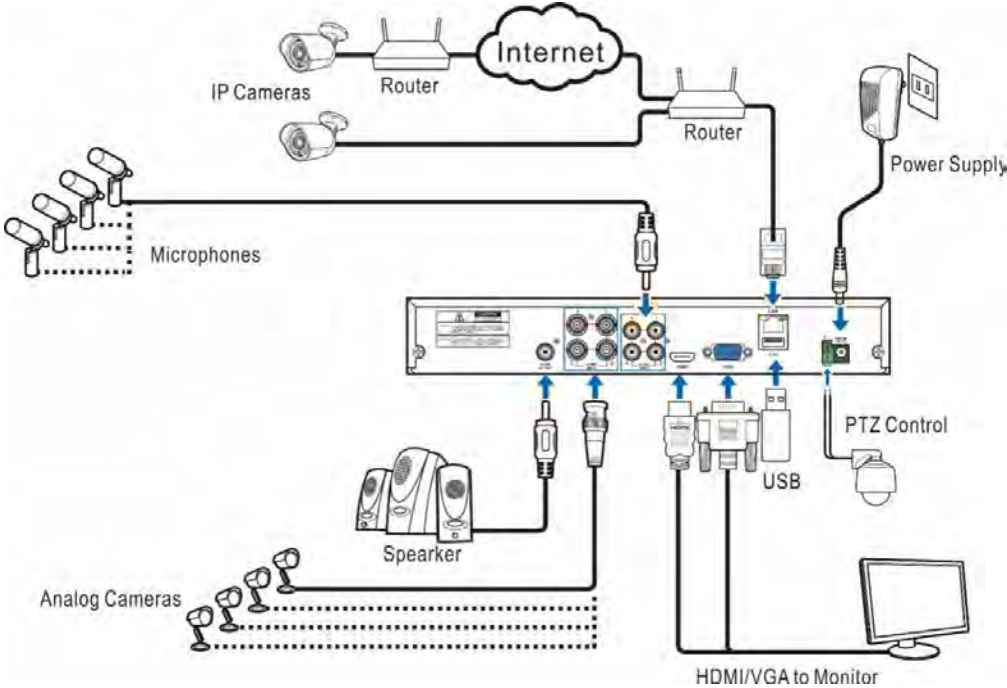


(3) Put the upper cover back carefully, and fix the cover with screws.

**2.2 Connection Diagram**

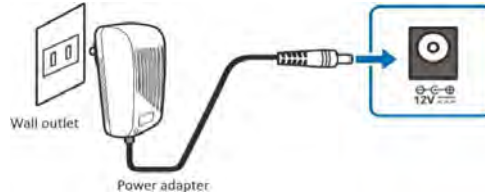

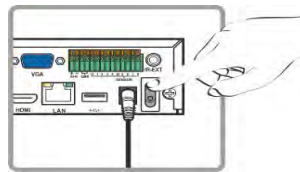
## 2.3 Power Supply Connection

**Caution:** Use only the supplied power adapter that came with the DVR

Connect one end of the power adapter to the power connector on the back of the DVR. Plug the other end of the power adapter into the wall outlet.



For some specific models, you may need to press the Power switch to turn on the power.

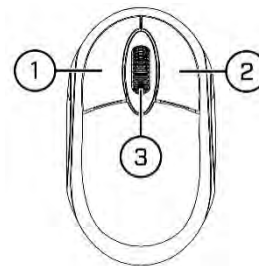


## Chapter 3 DVR Common Operations

### 3.1 Using the Supplied Mouse

1、 Left Button:

- Click to select menu options.
- During live viewing in split-screen view, double-click on a channel to view it in full-screen. Double-click the channel again to return to split-screen viewing.
- Click upon a channel on Live Viewing screen to open Camera Quick Toolbar.
- Click and hold to drag sliders and scales on menu mode



2、 **Scroll** Wheel:

- In menus, scroll to move up / down through the menu content.
- While hovering over the volume control wheel, scroll to turn system volume up / down.

### 3.2 Using the Virtual Keyboard

You will see the virtual keyboard automatically on the screen when you need to enter data

Click to toggle the keyboard to upper case and more punctuation



Click to delete a character

Click to complete the enter

Move the cursor to left

Move the cursor to right

### 3.3 Password

The first time you run a DVR, you must immediately set your password to protect your privacy. Be sure to record your user name and password and keep it in a secure place.



**Device ID:** Select the language of the interface

**Device ID:** Enter the device ID in parentheses. The default ID is 000000. For details on the device ID, see 1.1 General configuration 5.7.1 General Configuration.

**New Admin name:** Set up the administrator. Version 8.2.2 cannot modify the administrator user name.

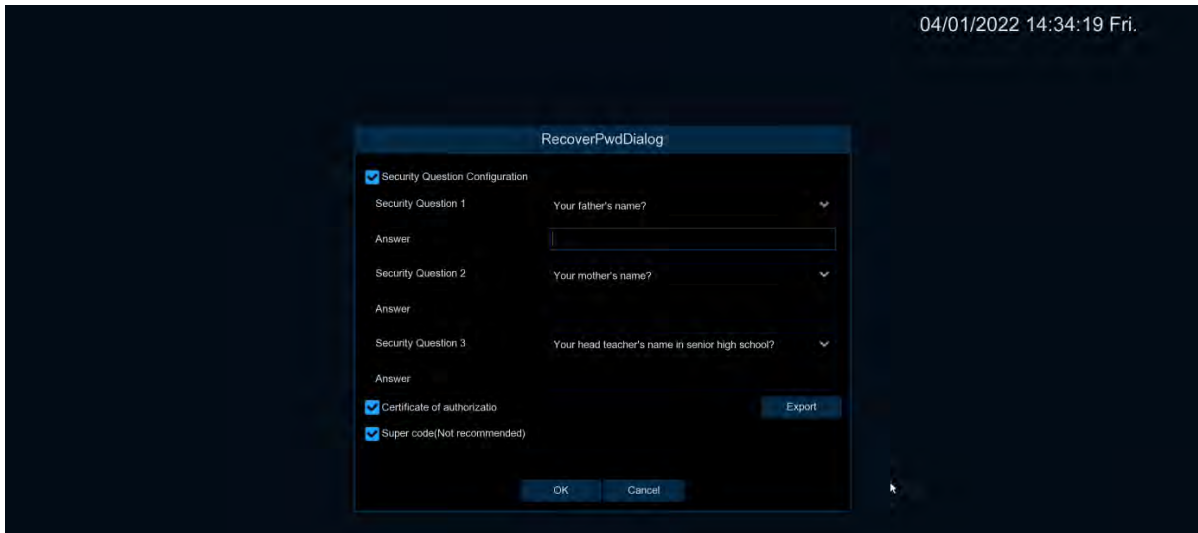
**New Admin Password:** Set up the administrator password. Password should be 8 to 15 characters, not the same as the user name, letters, numbers, special symbols to at least two combinations.

**Confirm Password:** Enter the password for the logged-in user again.

**Unlock Pattern Enable:** Enable the gesture password. Click the edit icon on the right to start setting the gesture password. After two confirmation, you can successfully set the gesture password.



Click **Apply** to confirm the Settings and enter the password recovery Settings page. You can open the corresponding password recovery method by checking the line, or click the **Cancel** button directly without checking, and do not open the password recovery function.



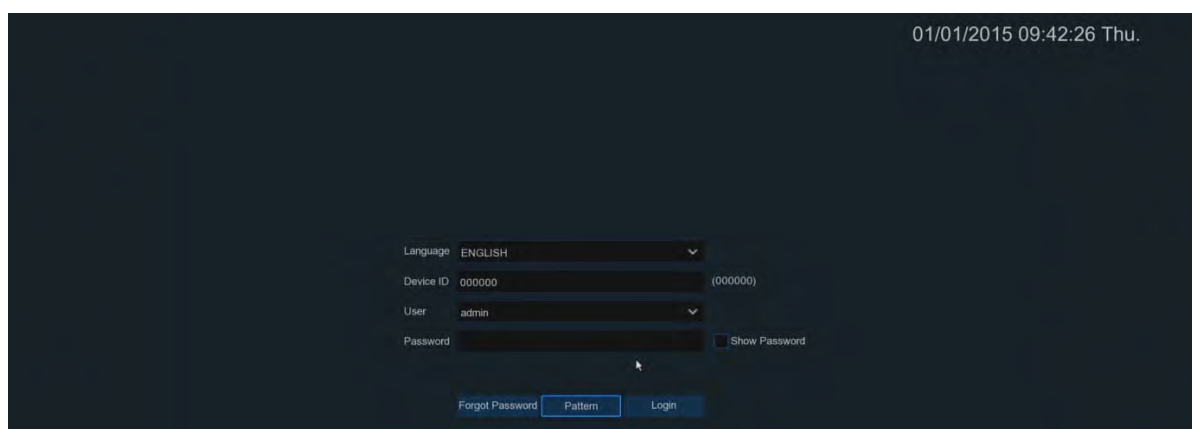


① **Security Question Configuration:** Question check and modify the main user password function. After opening, you need to choose 3 out of 15 common questions, and set the answer required to retrieve the password. The maximum length of the answer is 64 characters.

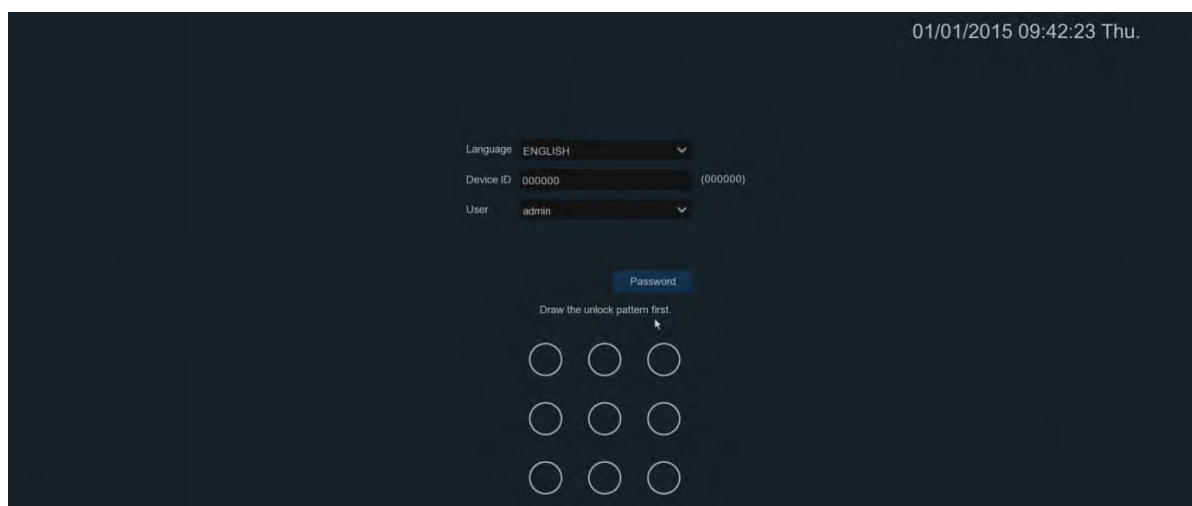
② **Certificate of authorization:** Use the key to modify the master user password function, and click Export to download the key file certificate. The txt goes to the U disk.

③ **Super code(Not recommended):** Use the super verification code to modify the master user password function, using the current DVR Mac address and DVR system time, to calculate a super verification code that can modify the master user password. However, the Mac address of DVR is broadcast in the network, and the DVR system can be directly obtained when using Super code to modify the main user password during login, so there are certain security risks, so it is not recommended for users to open it.

Then go to the login interface. Enter your username and password Click on **Login** to log in to the DVR system.



**Pattern:** Enter the gesture and password login interface



**Notice:**

If you forget two kinds of password, you will not be able to login the system. Please check **Forgot Password** to reset password. System will send the temporary password to the setting email. This password is used on login interface and User setting to change password. If you didn't set the email, please contact your reseller to reset password. (Some models didn't support FORGOT PASSWORD function.)

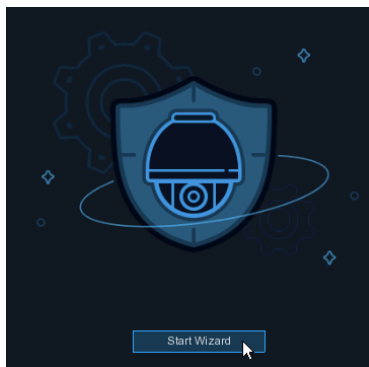
## Chapter 4 DVR Starting up

### 4.1 Start Wizard

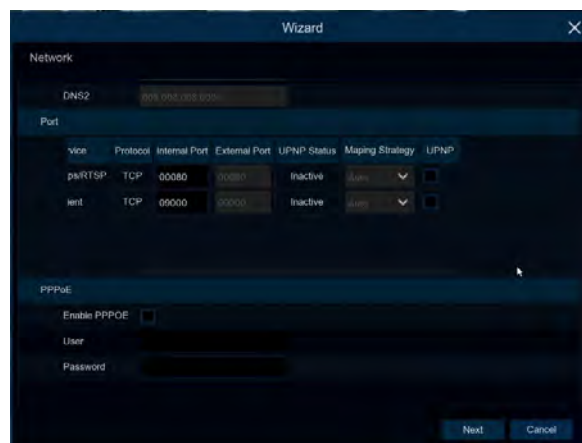
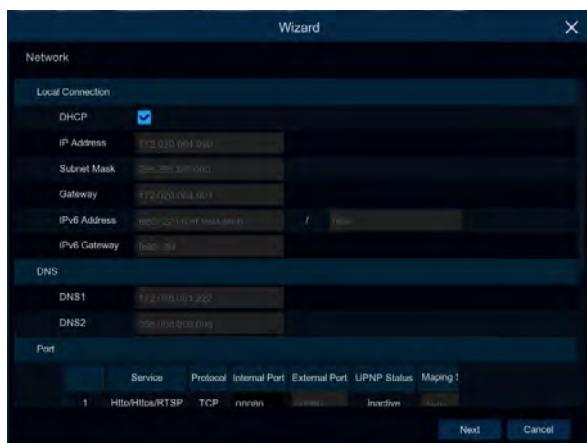
Startup Wizard will help to configure the system and get the DVR works quickly.

#### 4.1.1 Start Wizard

Click the **Start Wizard** to proceed to the next step



#### 4.1.2 Network configuration



If you connect to a router allows to use DHCP, please check the **DHCP** box. The router will assign automatically all the network parameters for your DVR. Unless the network is manually addressed below parameters:

**IP Address:** The IP address identifies the DVR in the network. It consists of four groups of numbers between 0 to 255, separated by periods. For example, “192.168.001.100”.

**Subnet Mask:** Subnet mask is a network parameter which defines a range of IP addresses that can be used in a network. If IP address is like a street where you live then subnet mask is like a neighborhood. The subnet address also consists of four groups of numbers, separated by periods. For example, “255.255.000.000”.

**Gateway:** This address allows the DVR to access the Internet. The format of the **Gateway** address is the same as the **IP Address**. For example, “192.168.001.001”.

**DNS1/DNS2:** DNS1 is the primary DNS server and DNS2 is a backup DNS server. Usually should be enough just to enter the DNS1 server address.

**Web Port:** This is the port that you will use to log in remotely to the DVR (e.g. using the Web Client). If the default port 80 is already taken by other applications, please change it.

**Client Port:** This is the port that the DVR will use to send information through (e.g. using the mobile app). If the default port 9000 is already taken by other applications, please change it.

**RTSP Port:** This is the port that the DVR will be allowed to transmit real-time streaming to other device (e.g. using a streaming Media player.).

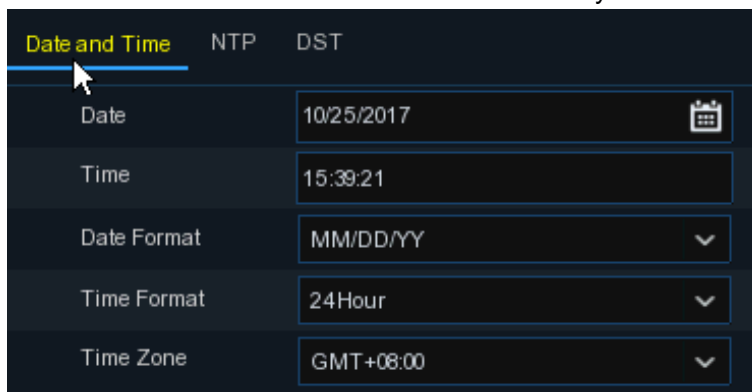
**UPnP:** If you want to log in remotely to the DVR using Web Client, you need to complete the port forwarding in your router. Enable this option if your router supports the UPnP. In this case, you do not need to configure manually port forwarding on your router. If your router does not support UPnP, make sure the port forwarding is completed manually in your router.

**PPPoE (Ethernet-based Point-Point Communication Protocol) dialing:** PPPoE (English: Point-to-Point Protocol Over Ethernet), peer-to-peer protocol on Ethernet, is a network tunneling protocol that encapsulates Point-to-Point Protocol (PPP) in an Ethernet (Ethernet) framework. Due to the integration of PPP protocol in the protocol, the functions of authentication, encryption and compression that cannot be provided by traditional Ethernet can also be used for ethernet protocol such as cable modem (cable modem) and digital user line (DSL).

### 4.1.3 Date/Time

This menu allows you to configure the Date, Time, Date Format, Time Format, Time Zone, NTP and DST.

**Date and Time:** Click on the calendar icon to set the current system date.



**Date:** Click on the calendar icon to set the system date.

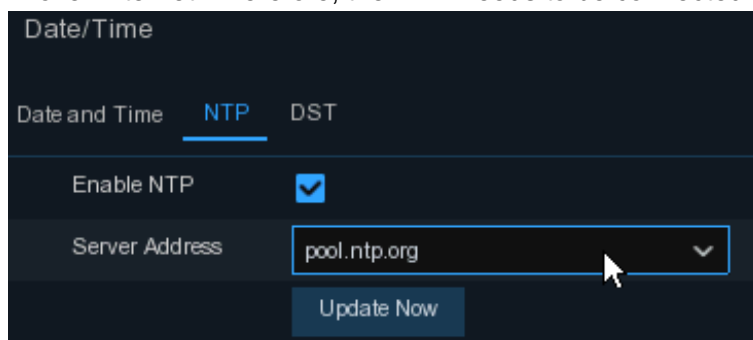
**Time:** Click to set the system time.

**Date Format:** Choose from the dropdown menu to set preferred date format.

**Time Format:** Choose time format between 24Hour and 12Hour.

**Time Zone:** Set the correct time zone.

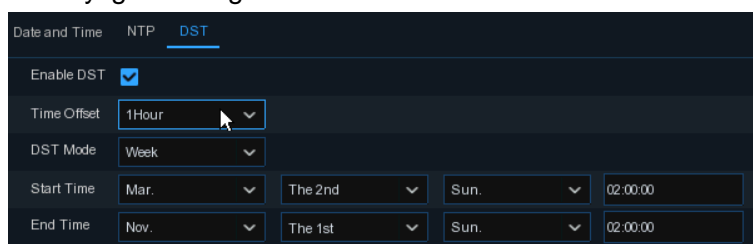
**NTP:** NTP stands for Network Time Protocol. This feature allows you to synchronize the date and time automatically on the DVR over Internet. Therefore, the DVR needs to be connected to the Internet.



Check the “NTP” box, and select the NTP server.

Choose the server address : time.windows.com,/time.nist.gov/pool.ntp.org/User-Defined

**DST:** DST stands for Daylight Savings Time.



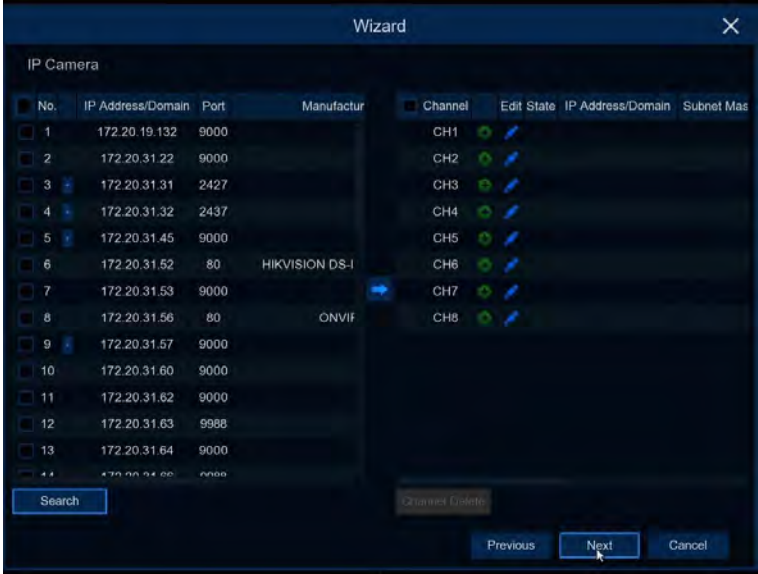
**DST:** Enable if Daylight Saving Time (DST) is observed in your region


**Time Offset:** Select the amount of time to offset for DST

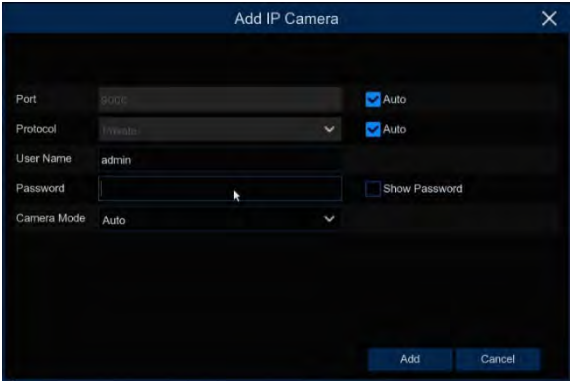
**Time Mode:** Choose to set the daylight-saving time in weeks or in days


**Start Time/End Time:** Set the start time and end time for daylight saving

4.1.4 IP Camera

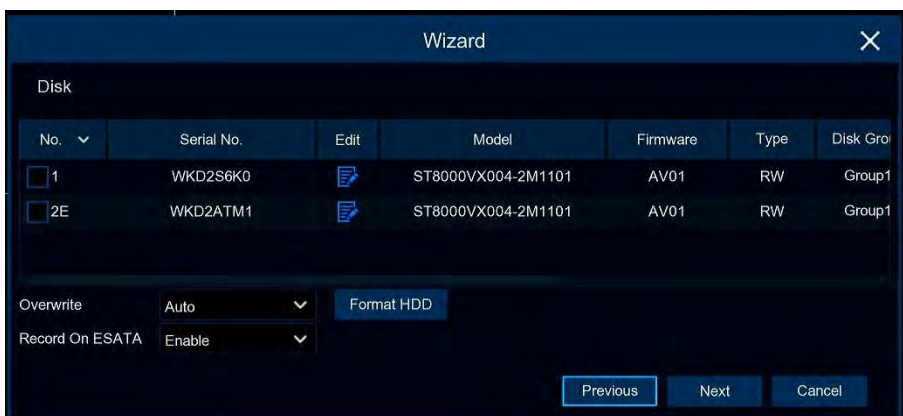


Click **Search** to search IP cameras in the same network. Choose the IP camera(s) you want to add, and then click  icon to add to the DVR



Enter the camera's user name & password to add the camera(s).  
You can also click  button to add individual IP camera to a single channel.  
Click **Search** button to search IP cameras, and then click one of the IP camera in the device list.  
**IP Address/Domain:** IP address or domain name of the IP camera  
**Alias:** Name of the IP camera  
**Port:** Port of the IP camera  
**Protocol:** Choose the protocol of the IP camera from the dropdown menu  
**User Name:** User Name of the IP camera  
**Password:** Password of the IP camera  
**Camera Mode:** Select the IP camera mode in the drop-down menu

### 4.1.5 Disk



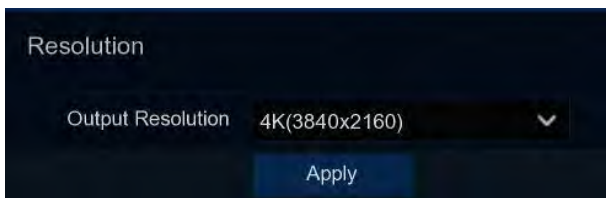
If the HDD is installed in the DVR for the first time, it must be formatted. Select the HDD and then click **Format HDD** button to format the HDD.

**Overwrite:** Use this option to overwrite the old recordings on the HDD when the HDD is full. For example, if you choose the option 7 days then only the last 7 days recordings are kept on the HDD. To prevent overwriting any old recordings, select Disable.

If you have disabled this function, please check the HDD status regularly, to make sure the HDD is not full.

**Record On ESATA:** If your DVR comes with an e-SATA port on the rear panel, you can enable to record the video to e-SATA HDD.

### 4.1.6 Resolution



Choose an output resolution matches to your monitor. The DVR supports to adjust the output resolution automatically to match the best resolution of your monitor when the system is starting up.

### 4.1.7 Mobile



If your DVR come with a P2P ID, you can scan the QR code with your mobile app to view the DVR remotely.

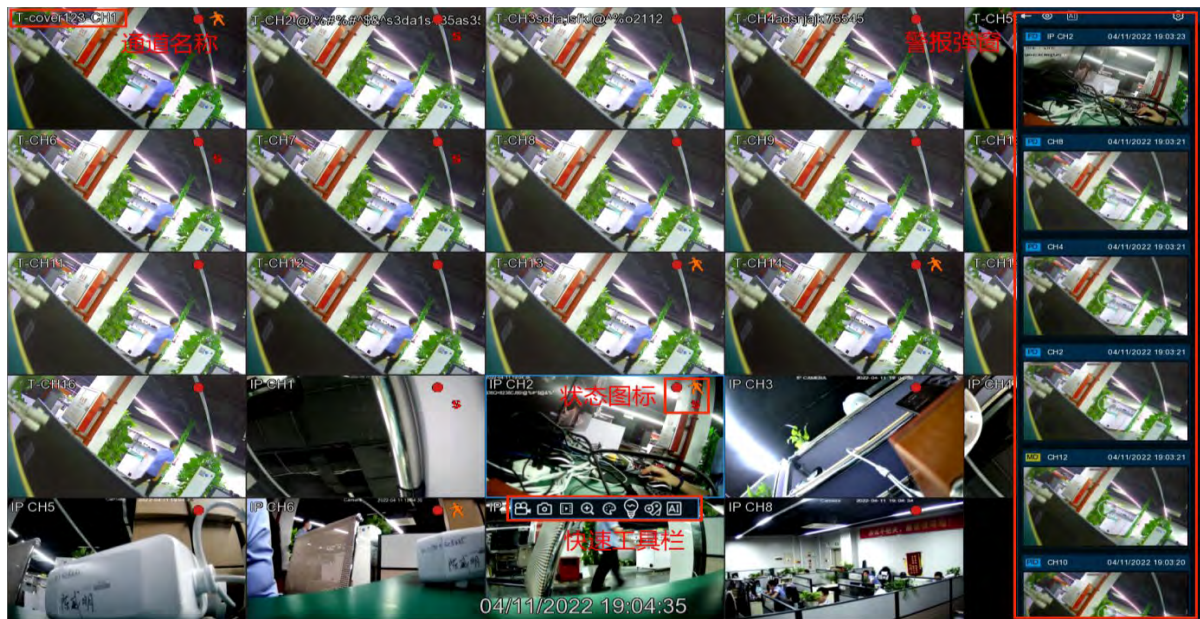
### 4.1.8 Summary



You can check the system summary information you had set in the start wizard and finish the wizard. Tick "**Don't show this window next time**" if you don't want to display Start Wizard when system reboot next time. Click **Finish** button to save & exit.



## 4.2 Introduction of the real-time view interface



### Camera name

Display the camera name

**A-**: This indicates that the connected camera is an AHD camera

**T-**: This indicates that the connected camera is a TVI camera

**C-**: This indicates that the connected camera is a CVI camera

**IP**: This indicates that the connected camera is an IP camera

### Status icon

**S** : A Smart alert is triggered

**PIR** : It means that the human body infrared sensing alarm is triggered

: This indicates that the channel is being video-recorded

: This indicates triggering the move detection

Show the triggered input and output IO alarm and video recording

: This icon indicates that the hard drive is not working properly

The icon indicates that the hard disk is unformatted

The icon indicates that the hard drive is full

The icon indicates that the hard drive is of a read-only status

**Off-line**: The analog camera is disconnected.

**No Camera**: No IP camera is connected.

**Decoding Failed**: This IP camera compression standard is not supported by DVR, please change to H.264 Compression standard.

**Resource Not Enough**: Insufficient resource, the main code stream does not support and all drawing / mjpeg format can only display one channel.

**Band Not Enough**: Insufficient bandwidth for the channel to go online

**Failed to connect to camera**: The IPC connection has failed

**User name or password error**: Wrong IPC username or password













Click to open the Quick Add menu to add an IP camera

Click to edit the current channel parameters

### 4.2.1 Camcorder Quick Toolbar
















In the preview screen, left-click on the attached camera to display the Quick Toolbar.



-  Video recording: Click to manually record the channel immediately. If a manual recording is ongoing, the icon is in red. Click Stop Manual recording again
-  Grab: Click to save a snapshot of the current camera image.
-  Instant playback: Click to play the last 5-minute video of this channel
-  PTZ: Click to enter the PTZ control panel
-  Click to put the channel. Scroll the mouse wheel to zoom the picture and drag the screen.
-  Click to adjust the image color of the channel. You can adjust the tone, brightness, contrast, and saturation of the image.
-   Switch the live video streams between the primary and subcode streams. HD is the main code outflow diagram, and SD is the subcode outflow diagram.
-  Click to manually turn / off the channel white light alarm, see [5.1.8 White Light](#). Also, this menu does not change the parameters within the white light settings.
-  Click to manually turn / off the channel alarm, see section [-5.1.8 White Light](#). Also, this menu does not change the parameters within the white light settings.
-  Label click to add labels
-  Statistics When AI is turned on, hover over the icon to view AI statistics

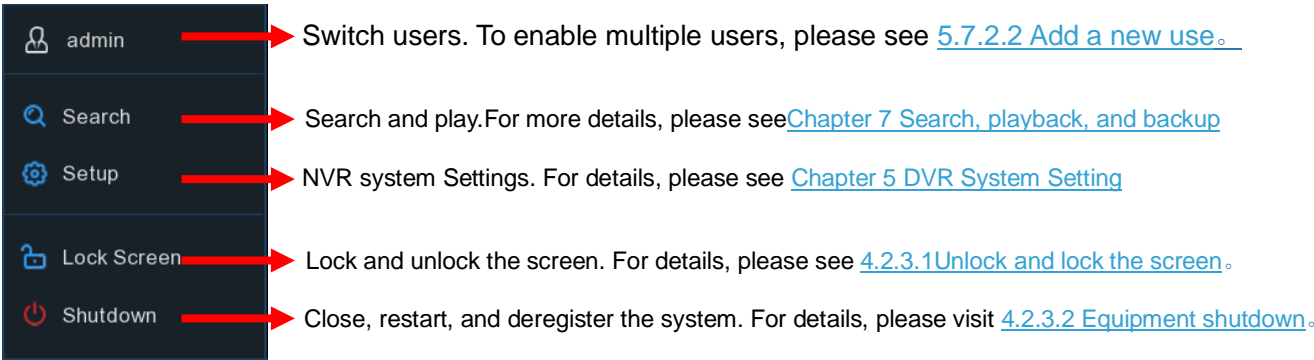
### 4.2.2 Taskbar



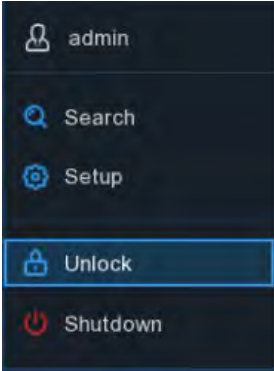
-  Click to Open the Start menu
-  Click to select a different layout to preview the display
-  Click to select more layouts to preview the display
-  Round tour, click to start preview the channel in sequence
-  Quick playback, you can replay all the channels from the start of the day, or click on the lower right triangle to select from the nearest 5s, 10s, 30s, 1Min, 5Min to start the play.
-  Click to adjust the volume
-  Click to switch all IP channels to primary or substreams for a preview
-  Click to switch between the original scale screen or the stretch screen.
-  Click to switch between the balanced or smooth views. Preview mode affects preview video quality only through bit and frame rates, but not the recording quality.
-  There is no connection network
-  This icon appears if the network is disconnected.
-  The network connection was successful
-  Turn the lights and alarms on or off for all channels
-  Start or stop the manual video recording and the manual alarm.
-  View system information, channel information, record information, and network status.

### 4.2.3 The Start Menu

With the Start menu, you can switch between users, search and playback, enter the System Settings menu, lock and unlock the screen, close, restart and log out the system.



#### 4.2.3.1 Unlock and Lock the screen

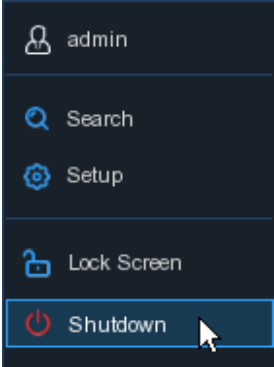


If the NVR is not operated on the Menu for a long time, the screen is locked to protect unauthorized OSD operations. For details, see Menu Timeout (min) in [5.7.1.1 General Configuration](#)

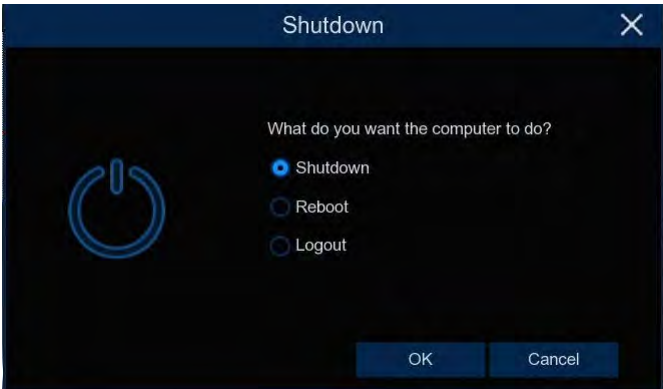
You can also manually lock the screen if necessary. To do this, go to the Start menu and then click the Lock screen icon to lock the system immediately.

#### 4.2.3.2 Equipment shutdown



Click the **Shutdown** button from Star Menu, and the check the further action you want to move. Click **OK** button, system will require to input the admin password to authenticate

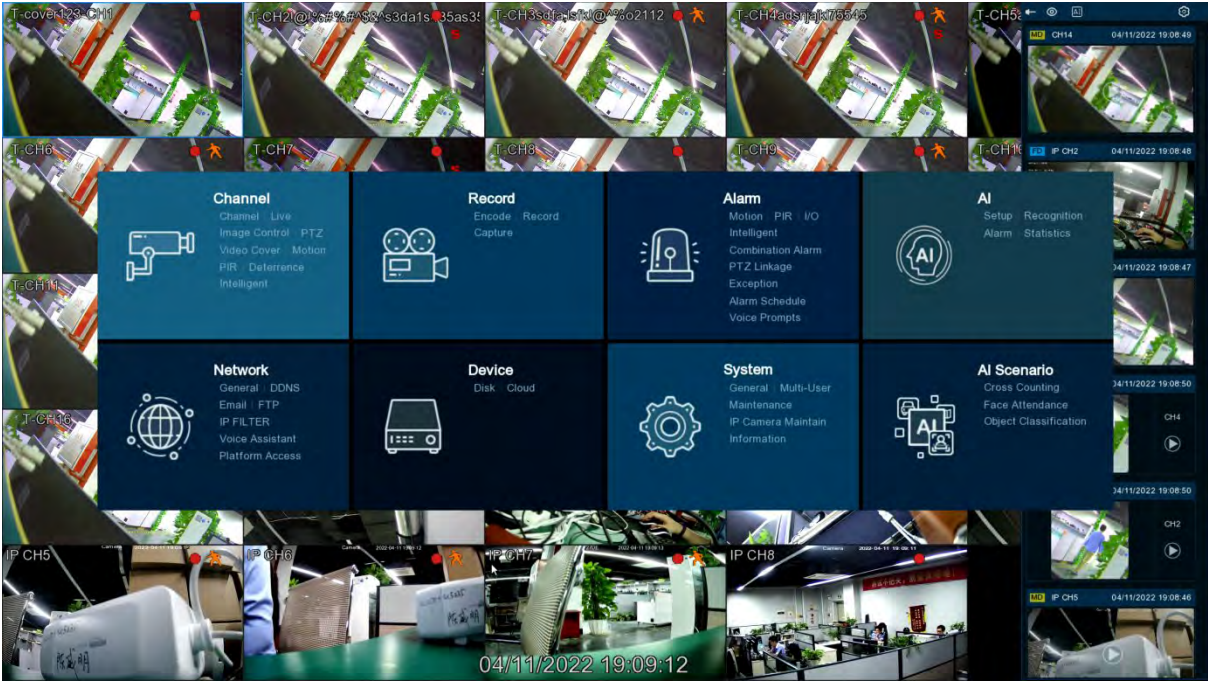




If you select to log out the system (**Logout**), the live viewing screen disappears. You will need to log in to the system for further operations.

You can configure channels, records, alerts, network, device, and system parameters, location: **Start Menu** → **Setup**.

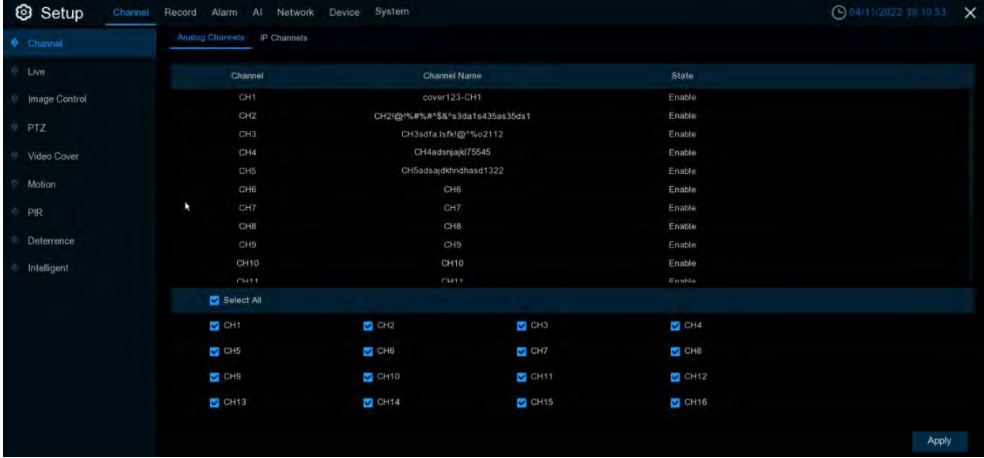


#### 5.1 Channel

In this section, you are allowed to configure the camera, live view display, manage IP cameras, adjust IP camera's image, PTZ setup, motion setup, convert mode, and more.

### 5.1.1 Channel

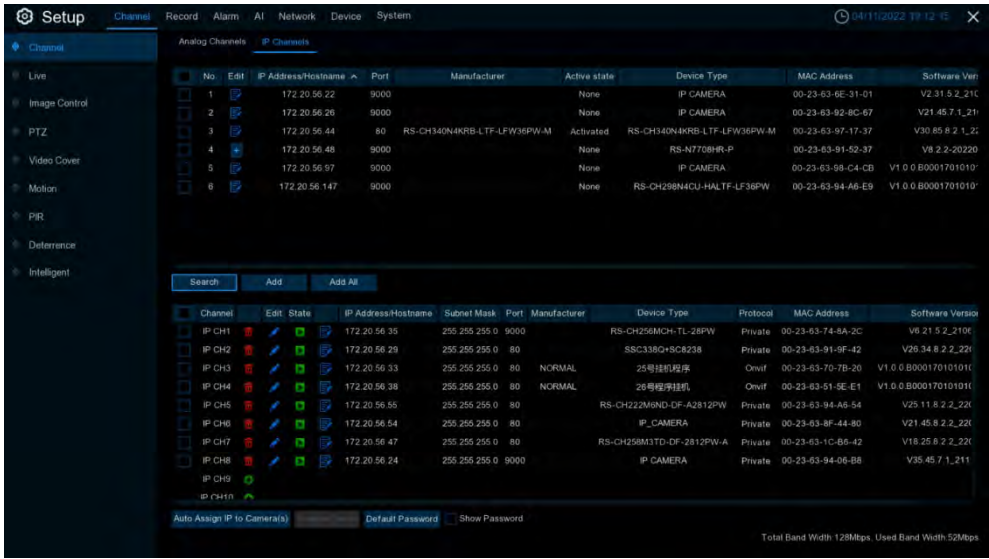
#### 5.1.1.1 Channel setup



Analog channels and digital channels can be converted to each other. Just select Digital or Analog in the channel you want to convert and save it to take effect. Therefore, you need to enable XVR mode (System->General-> Mode). Please see [5.7.1.1 General Setting](#) for more details.

Moreover, part of the device supports adding wireless channels. Choose the **Wireless**, save, the sub channel will become wireless channel. Choose the **Digital**, it will back to digital channel. Please note, analog channel can't switch to wireless channel.

#### 5.1.1.2 IP Channels



Click **Search** to search IP cameras from local network, click **Add** + to add individual IP camera, click **Add All** to add all IP cameras.

**Protocol:** Choose the protocol of the IP camera from the dropdown menu

**Connect Mode:** When you select the onvif protocol, select **General** or **Security** from the drop-down menu. **General** represents http connection onvif; **Security** representative first asks if IPC supports https, if supported, provide certificate, https, if not, http.

**Auto Assign IP to Camera(s):** The added IP camera would be not able to connect if its IP address is not in the same network segment with DVR. With this function to reassign an IP address to all added IP cameras.

**Channel Delete:** Choose one or more added IP cameras, and click this button to delete.

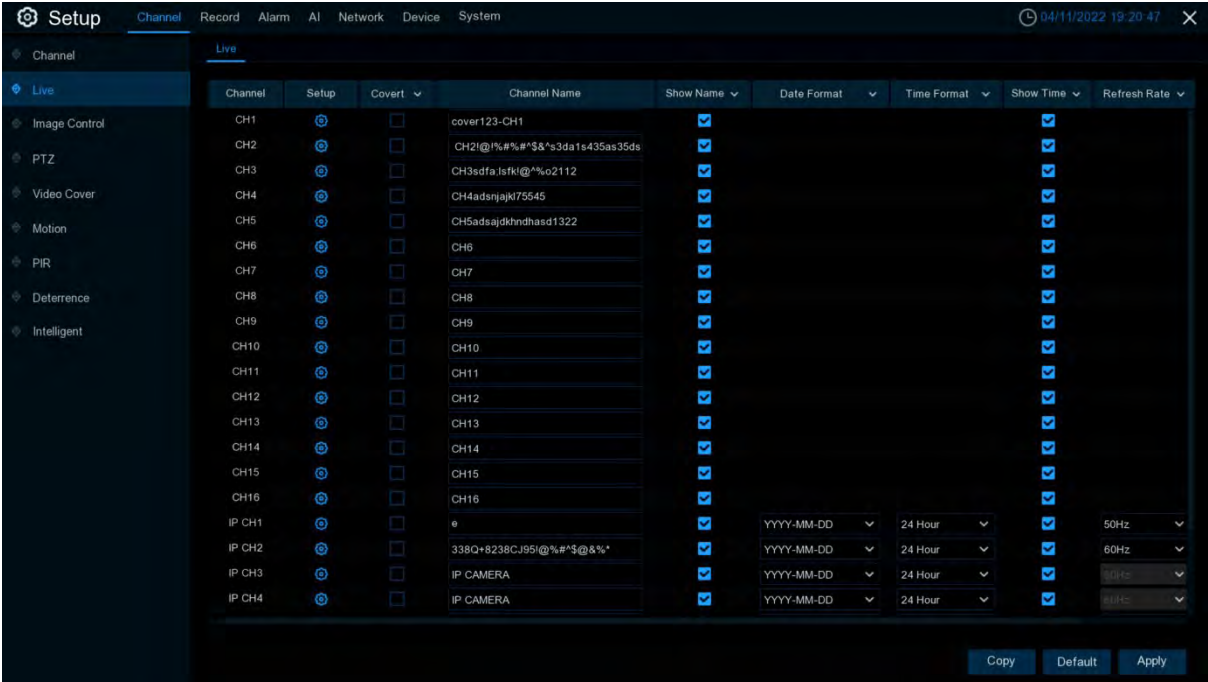
**Default Password:** To set IP camera's default password

Click Edit icon and enter the IP camera edit menu.

**Show Password:** Enter the DVR password, which can clearly display the password of the connection IPC set by each channel.

5.1.2 Live

Configure the video camera parameters.



**Channel:** Display channel name.  
**Setup:** Click icon into the setup page.

- Channel: CH1 → Select the channel
- Channel Name: Camera → Name the channel
- Date Format: DD/MM/YYYY → The date format displayed by the camera
- Time Format: 24 Hour → Time format displayed by the camera
- Refresh Rate: 60Hz → Camera refresh rate
- Show Name → The camera name is displayed in the preview
- Show Time → The system time is displayed in the preview
- Alpha: 64 → Text transparency
- HUE: 128 → Adjust the tone of the image color
- BRIGHT: 128 → Adjust the brightness of the image color
- CONTRAST: 128 → Adjust the contrast of the image color
- SATURATION: 128 → Adjust the saturation of the image color

Click Default to restore the Default Settings of image color, click Apply to save the Settings, and right-click to exit.

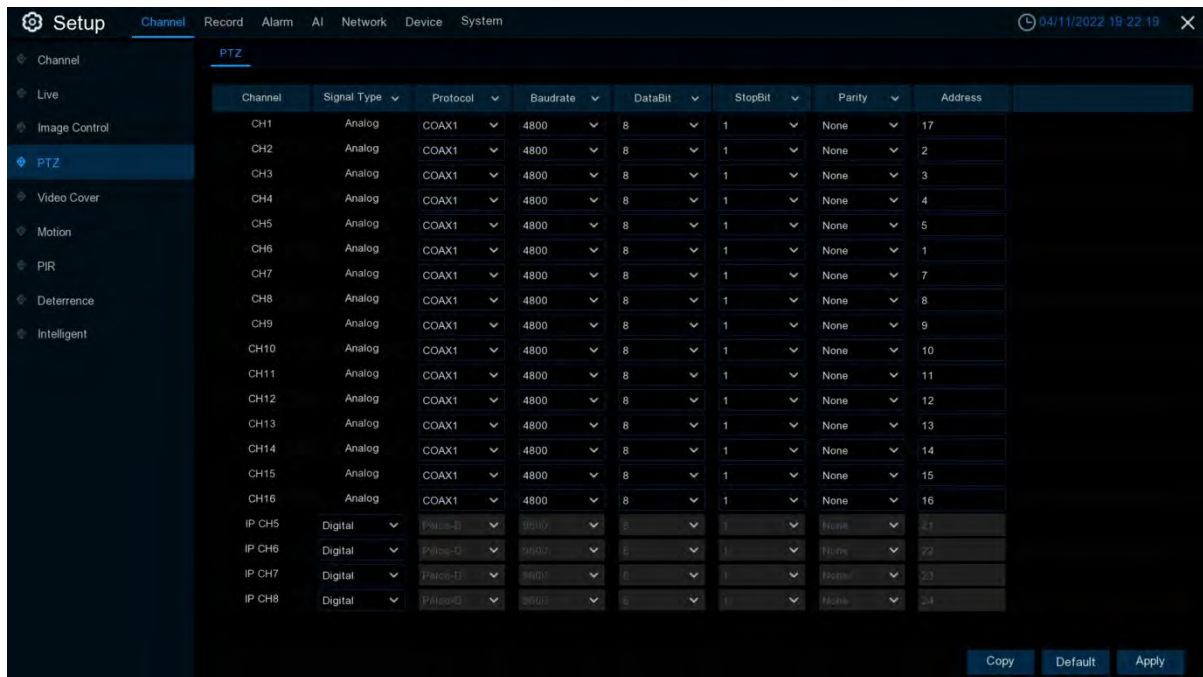

- Select the desired built-in IR cut filter mode to ensure the camera works properly both in the day and night.
- Set the delay time of IR-CUT switching
- Set IR-LED mode, there are OFF, ON, Auto, two sets of INFRARED light IPC more. Out of the Manual option, you can manually adjust the brightness of two sets of infrared lamp manual.
- Check to enable lens flip, Angle flip, and corridor mode
- Check to enable lens flip and angle flip
- To enable or disable Backlight compensation
- Choose the backlight compensation level
- To enable or disable 3D noise reduction function
- Set the 3D noise reduction level
- Enable to allow automatically adjust the brightness and contrast of the video when shooting in the darkness with bright light sources.

**Protocol:** Choose the communication protocol between the PTZ capable camera and DVR. If your camera support UTC (Up the Coax) function, you can choose COAX1 or COAX2 to display your camera OSD menu or control the UTC PTZ function.

**Baudrate:** The speed of the information sent from the DVR to the PTZ-capable camera. Make sure it matches the compatibility level of your PTZ-capable camera.

**DataBit / StopBit:** The information between the DVR and PTZ-capable camera is sent in individual packages. The **DataBit** indicates the number of bits sent, while the **EndBit** indicates the end of the package and the beginning of the next (information) package. The available parameters for **DataBit** are: **8, 7, 6, 5**. the available parameters for the **StopBit** are **1** or **2**.

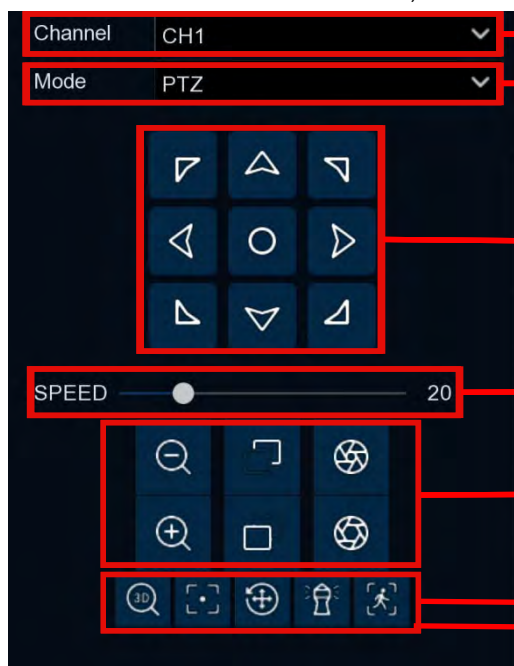
**Parity:** For error check. See the documentation of your PTZ-capable camera, to configure this setting.

**Address:** Set the command address of the PTZ system. Please be noted that each PTZ-capable camera needs a unique address to function properly

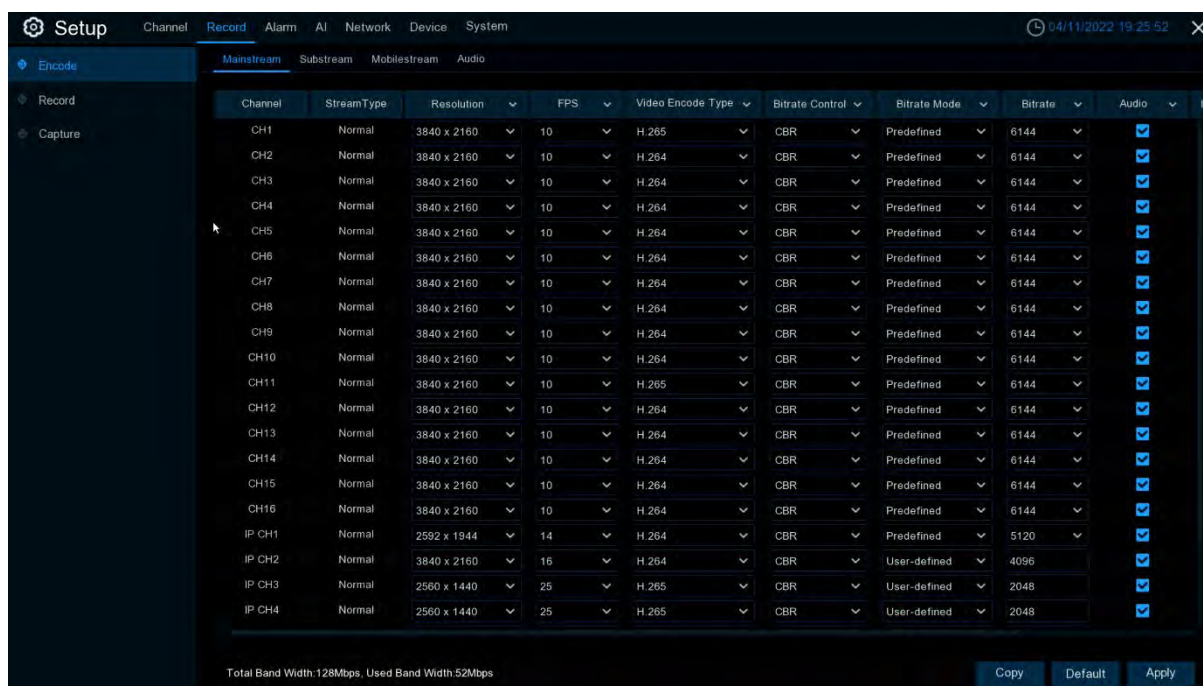
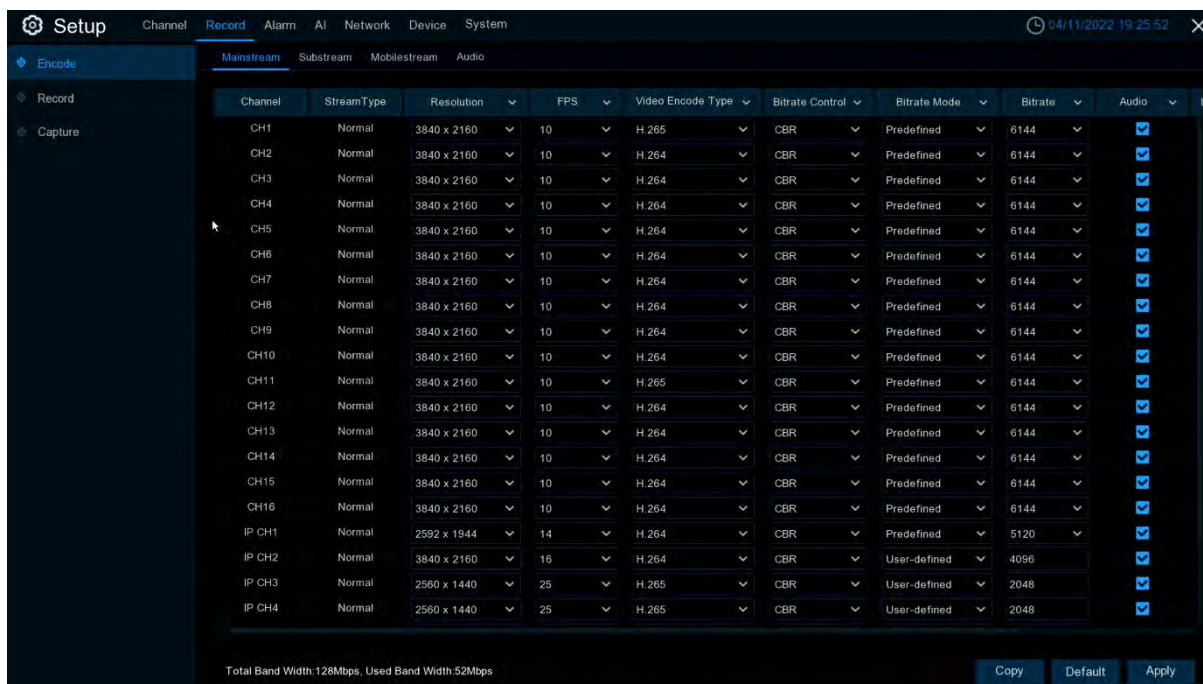
## 5.2 Recording

This menu allows you to configure the video recording parameters

### 5.2.1 Encoding

This menu allows you to configure the image quality for recorded video or network transfers. Generally, the master stream is the quality of the recorded video that will be saved in the HDD; the substream is the preview video quality through remote access (such as the Web client and CMS). Mobile code stream defines the preview quality of viewing remotely using mobile devices, and the switch of the connected IP camera's audio, the input and output volume, and the audio type can be set at the Audio interface.

#### 5.2.1.1 Mainstream



**Resolution:** This parameter represents the resolution of the recorded image.

**FPS:** This parameter represents the number of frames recorded by the DVR.

**Video Encode Type:** Channel decoding type, with 264, 265, 264 +, 265 +, and MJPEG.





**Resolution:** This parameter represents the resolution of the recorded image.

**FPS:** This parameter represents the number of frames recorded by the DVR.

**Video Encode Type:** Channel decoding type, with 264,265,264 +, 265 +, and MJPEG.

**Bitrate Control:** Select the bit rate level. For simple scenarios, for example, a gray wall is suitable for using a constant bit rate (CBR). For more complex scenarios, such as busy streets, it is suitable for using a variable bit rate (VBR).

**Video Quality:** The optional values are Lowest, Lower, Low, Medium, Higher, and Highest

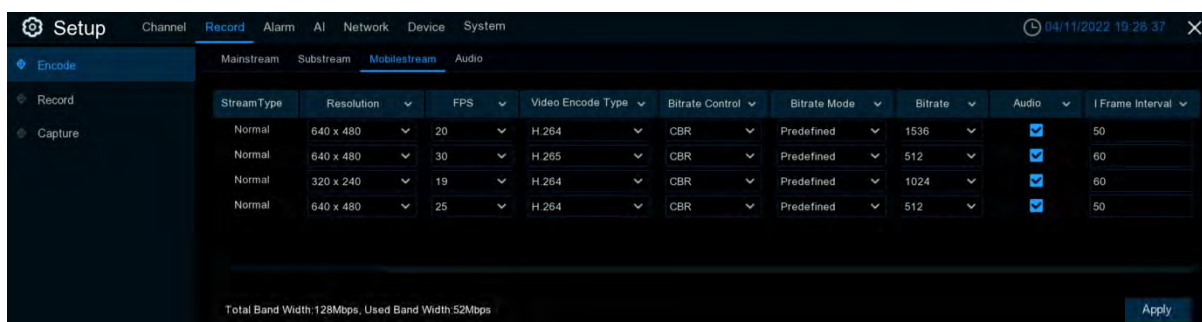

**I Frame Interval (I frame interval):** Set the I frame interval for the camera.

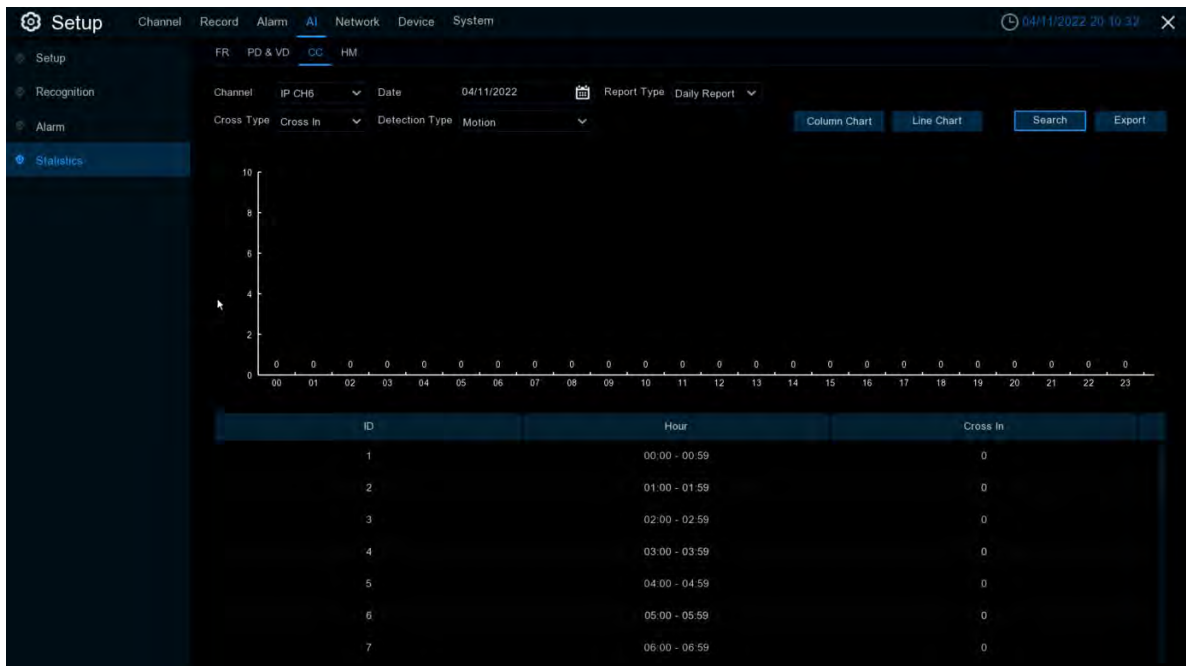

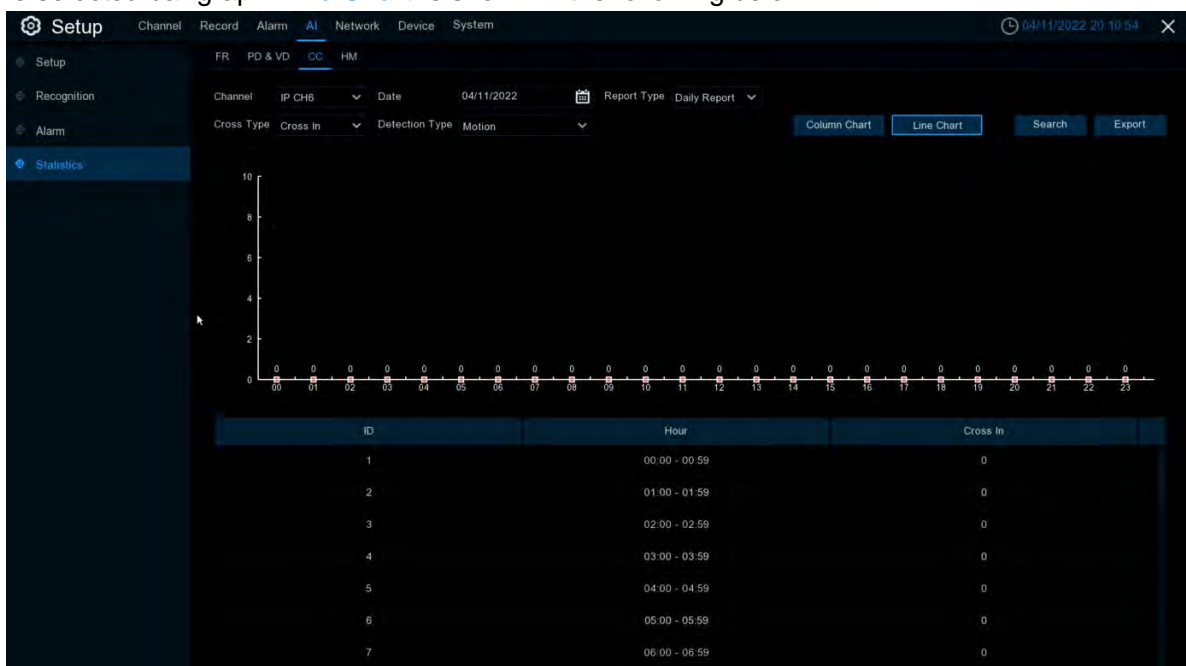

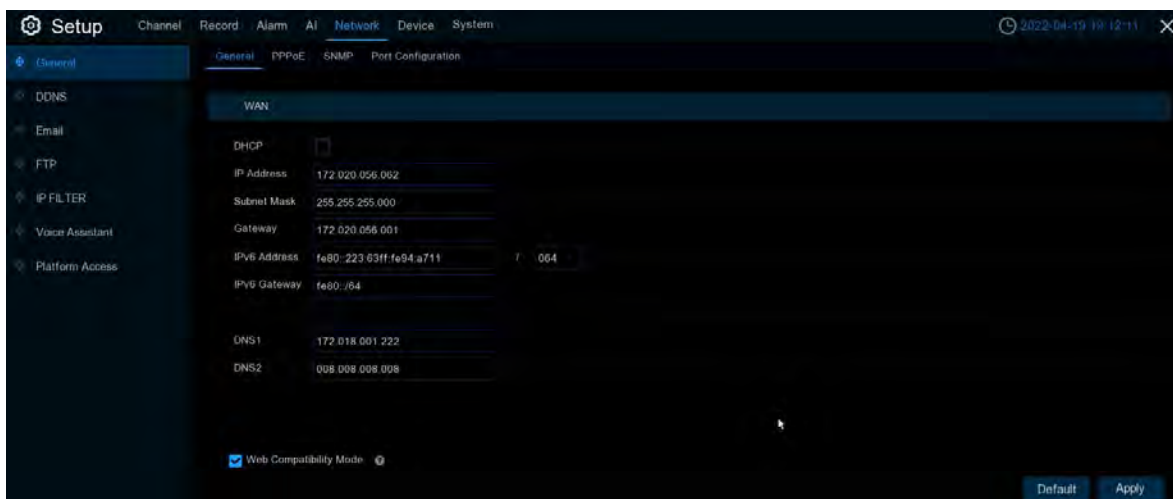


## 5.5 Network

This menu allows you to configure network parameters like PPPoE, DHCP and so on. The most common type is the DHCP. Your network type is most likely DHCP unless the network is manually addressed. If an authentication user name and password are required to access the Internet, select PPPoE.

### 5.5.1 General

#### 5.5.1.1 General configuration



If you connect to a router that allows for DHCP s, check the DHCP box. The router automatically assigns all the network parameters to the DVR. Unless you manually set the following parameters for the network:

**IP Address:** The IP address is the identity of the DVR in the network. It consists of four groups of numbers between 0 and 255, separated by periods. For example, "192.168.001.100".

**Subnet Mask:** A Subnet mask is a network parameter that defines the IP address range that can be used in a network. If the IP address is like the street where you live, then the subnet mask is like a neighborhood. Subnet addresses also consisted of four sets of numbers, separated by periods. For example, "255.255.000.000"

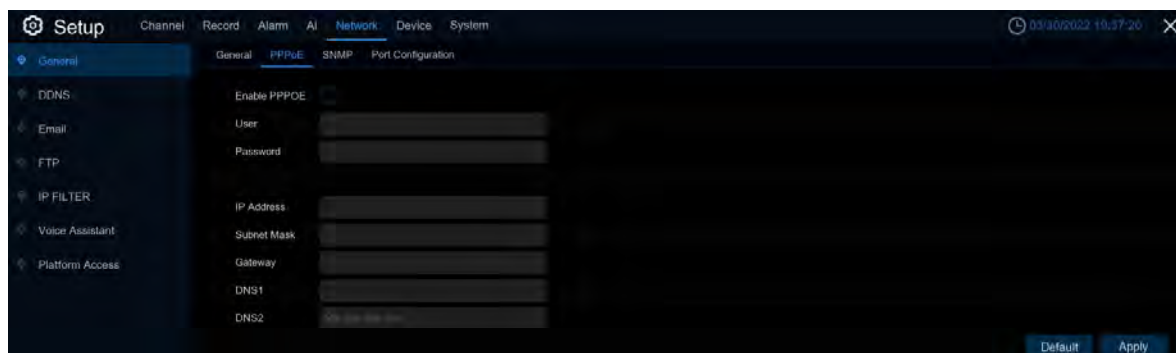
**Gateway:** The gateway IP address of the network where the device is located, by default: 192.168.001.001.

**IPv6 Address:** The IPv6 address is the identity of the DVR in the network. It consists of eight sets of numbers, between 0 and FFFF, and separated by colons. For example, "ABCD: EF01:2345:6789: ABCD: EF01:2345:6789".

**DNS1 / DNS2:** DNS1 is the main DNS server, and DNS2 is the standby DNS server. Usually just enough to enter the DNS1 server address.

**Web Compatibility Mode:** After opening HTTPS, if the Win7 system computer login, you need to check this item to switch to the HTTPS page

#### 5.5.1.2 PPPo E



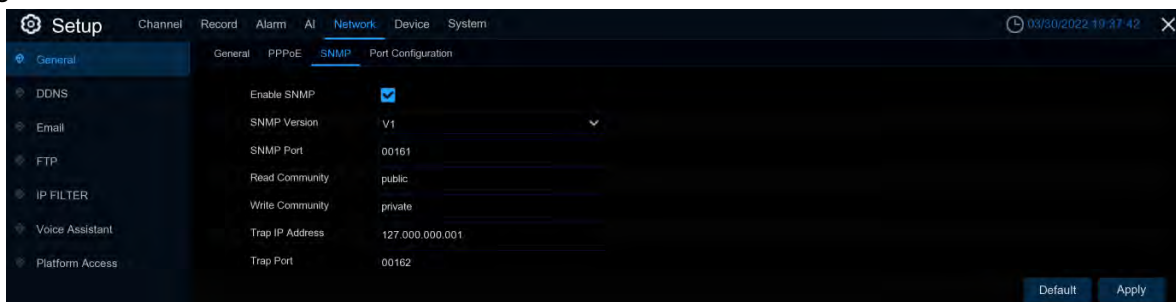
Enabling PPPoE networking will allow devices to connect to the network via dial-up Internet access.

Select the Enable PPPOE box, and then enter the user name and password for the PPPoE.

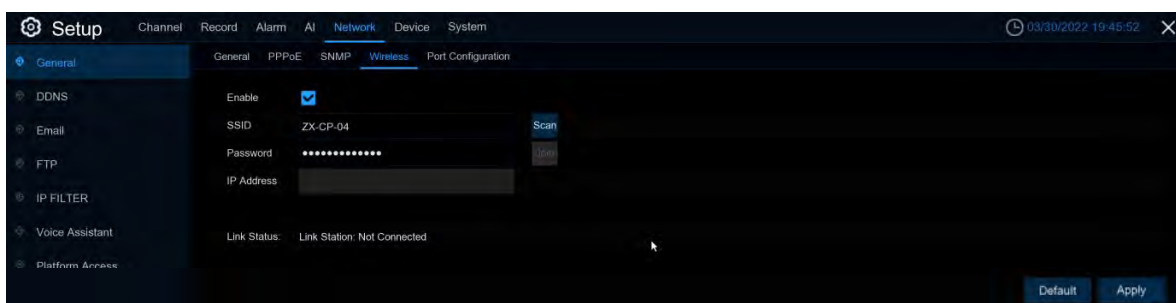
### 5.5.1.3 SNMP

By configuring the SNMP (Simple Network Management Protocol) parameters, the network management side can obtain the equipment information after the network management platform connects with the equipment, which facilitates the maintenance and management of the equipment on the network management side.



After checking Enable SNMP, part of DVR information, such as software version number, device type, channel IP, resolution, frame number, can be obtained through SNMP tool.

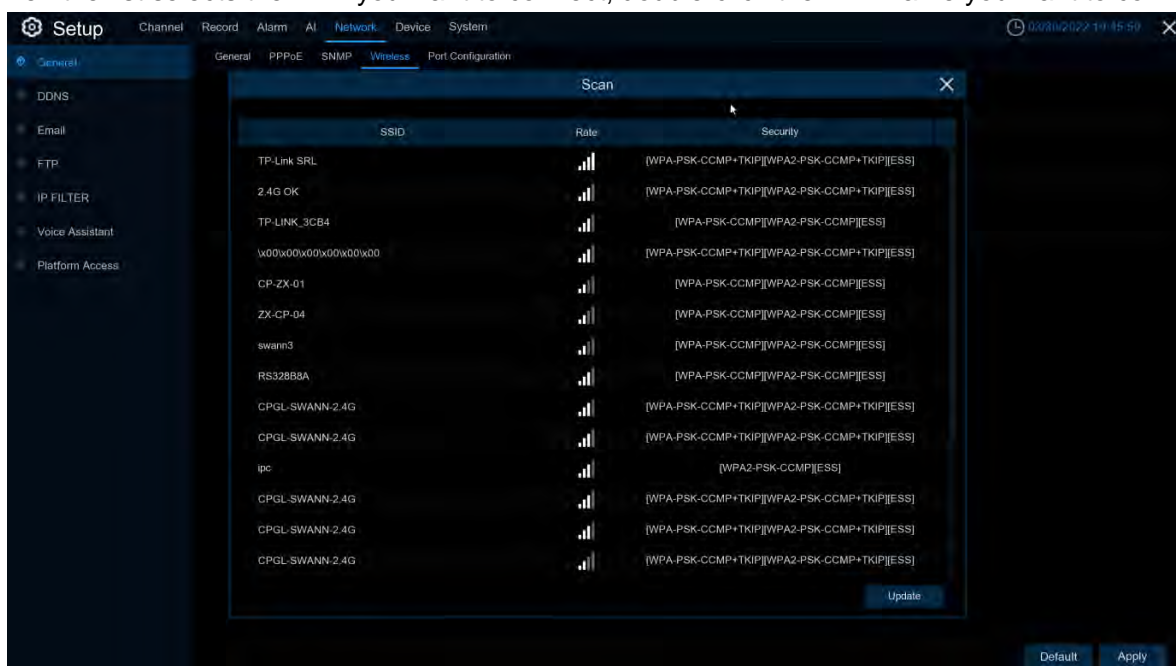

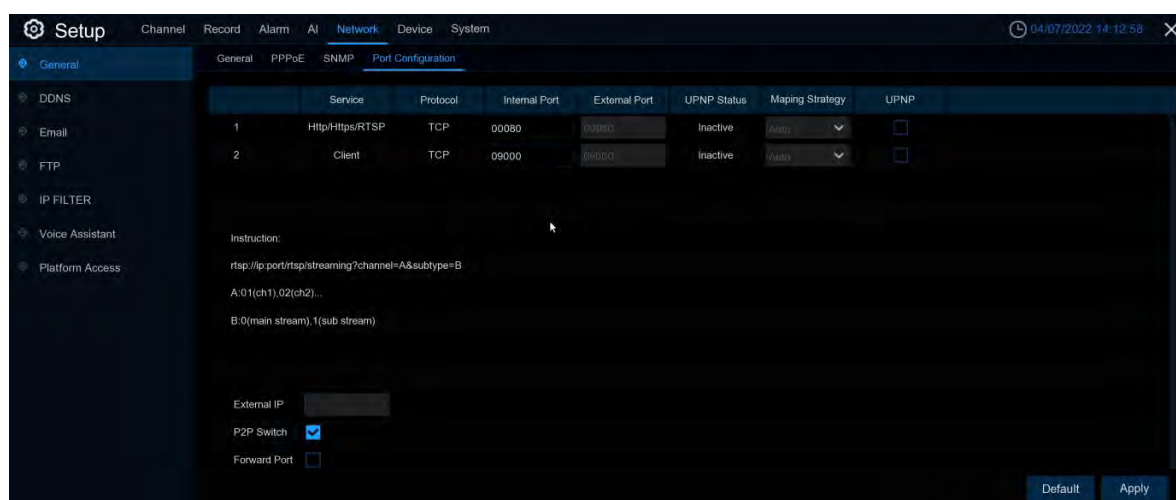

### 5.5.1.5 Port Configuration



**Web Port (Web port):** This is the port you will use to log on to DVR (for example, using a Web client). Change the default port 80 if it is already occupied by another application.

**Client Port (Media Port):** This is the port that the DVR uses to send messages (for example, using mobile applications). If the default port 9000 is already used by another application, change it.

**RTSP Port (RTSP port):** This is the port where the DVR is allowed to transfer live streams to other devices (for example, using a streaming player).

**Https Port (Https port):** The Https port is a web browsing port, mainly for HTTPS services, and is another HTTP that provides encryption and transmission through a secure port.

**Note:** Version 8.2.2 combines WEB port, RTSP port, and HTTPS port with one port, and the default is 80.

**UPNP (Universal Plug and Play):** If you want to log on to the DVR remotely in a different LAN, you need to complete the port mapping in the router. Enable this option if your router supports UPnP. In this case, you do not have to manually configure the port mapping on the router. If your router does not support UPnP, make sure that the port mapping is done manually in the router.

**Mapping Strategy:** set to manually set the External Port port.

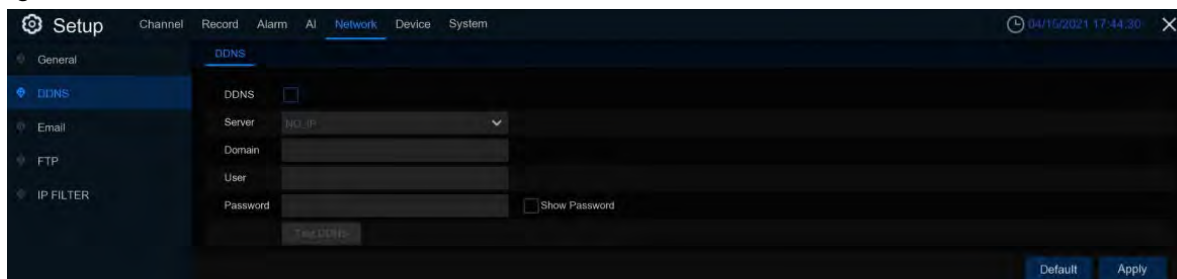
**P2P Switch:** P2P switch, closed P2P will not work.

**Forward Port:** The IPC hyperlink switch opens to access the IPC WEB page through the hyperlink on the Web end of the DVR. Currently, only available through the Web port or search, and supported API IPC can be accessed using hyperlinks.



### 5.5.2 DDNS (Dynamic Domain name server)

This menu configure DDNS settings. The DDNS provides a static address to simplify the remote connection to the DVR. To use DDNS, you first need to open an account on the DDNS service provider's DNS web page.



**DDNS:** Check to enable DDNS.

**Server:** Select the preferred DDNS Server (DDNS\_3322, DYNDNS, NO\_IP, CHANGEIP, DNSEXIT).

**Domain:** Enter the domain name you created on the DDNS service provider's web page. Connect to the DVR when you want to connect remotely via a PC, this is the address you type in the URL box.

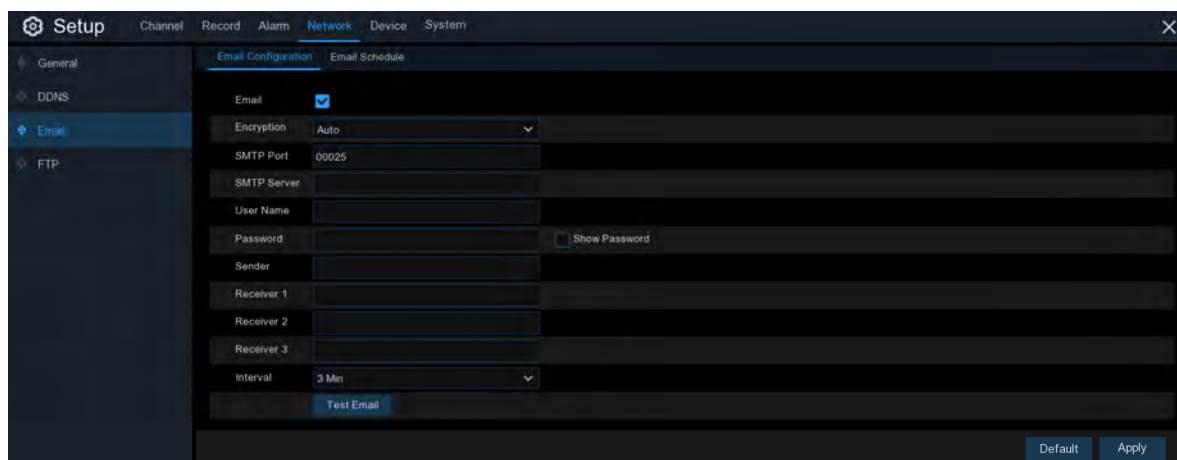
**User / Password:** Enter the user name and password you get when creating an account on the DDNS provider's service web page.

After all parameters are entered, click **Test DDNS** to test the DDNS settings. If the test result is "Network is unreachable or DNS is incorrect", please check whether the network works fine, or the DDNS information is correct or not.

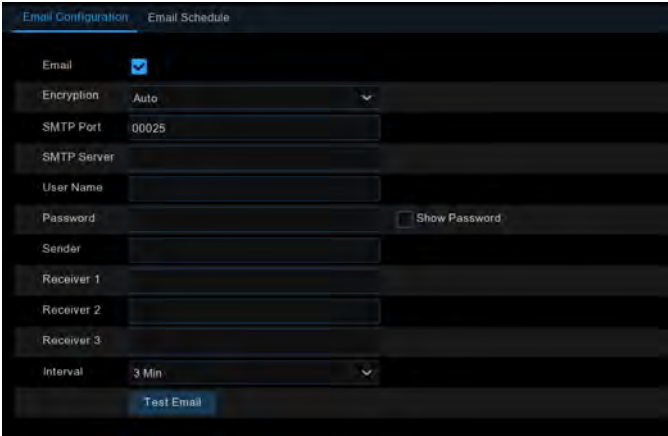
When the user applies for dynamic domain name service, you can use the browser to remotely access DVR through the domain name, domain name form `http://domain name:mapped Web port number`, when using DDNS domain name to access DVR, need to confirm that the port and the current IP can be normally connected on the public network, the server address / host name / user name / password / setting is consistent with the DVR setting.

### 5.5.3 Email

This menu allows you to configure email settings. Please complete these settings if you want to receive the system notifications on your email when an alarm is triggered, HDD becomes full, HDD is in error state, or Video Loss occurs.



5.5.3.1 Email Configuration



- Email:** Check to enable.
  - Encryption:** Enable if your email server requires the SSL or TLS verification. If you are not sure, set to be **Auto**.
  - SMTP Port:** Enter the SMTP port of your email server.
  - SMTP Server:** Enter the SMTP server address of your email.

  - Password:** Enter the password of your email.
  - Receiver 1~3:** Enter the email address where you want to receive the event notifications from the DVR.

## 5.6 Device

In this section, you can configure the internal HDD & Cloud storage function.

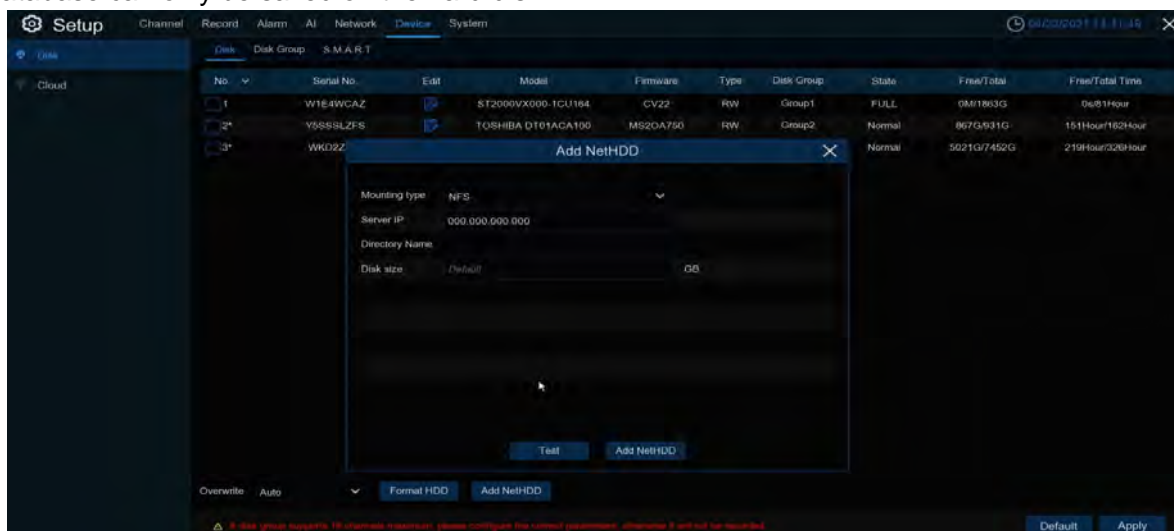
### 5.6.1 Disk

This menu allows you to check & configure the internal HDD(s). You need to format the HDD only at the first startup and if you replace a new HDD.



**Format HDD:** Select the HDD you want to format and then click **Format HDD**. To start formatting, you need to enter your user name and password and then click **OK** to confirm to continue formatting.

**ADD NetHDD:** You can use this function to ADD network disks. After a network hard disk (NAS) is configured, you can connect the NAS to the network to record channel videos or capture pictures. But the AI face database can only be saved on the hard disk.



Mounting Type Mounting mode (NFS or CIFS) NFS does not need to enter the NAS account password, whereas CIFS requires the NAS account and password.

**User Name:** Enter the NAS account (unselectable in NFS mode).

**Password:** Enter the Password of the NAS (unselectable in NFS mode).

**Server IP:** Enter the NAS IP address.

**Directory Name:** Enter the folder where you want to store data in the NAS.


**Disk Size:** Sets the Size of the network hard drive.

**Test:** tests whether the NAS is connected.

**Add NetHDD:** Click to Add NAS.

**Overwrite:** Use this option to overwrite the old recordings on the HDD when the HDD is full. For example, if you choose the option 7 days then only the last 7 days recordings are kept on the HDD. To prevent overwriting any old recordings, select **OFF**. If you have disabled this function, please check the HDD status regularly, to make sure the HDD is not full. Recording will be stopped if HDD is full.

**Record on ESATA:** This menu only displayed when your DVR is coming with an e-SATA port on the rear panel. It will allow to record the video to external e-SATA HDD to enhance your HDD capacity. If the e-SATA recording function is enabled, e-SATA backup function will be disable

If your DVR supports to install multiple HDDs, the edit icon  appears in your system, you can click it to edit the HDD as below:



**Disk Type:** Read-write, read-only, and redundant.

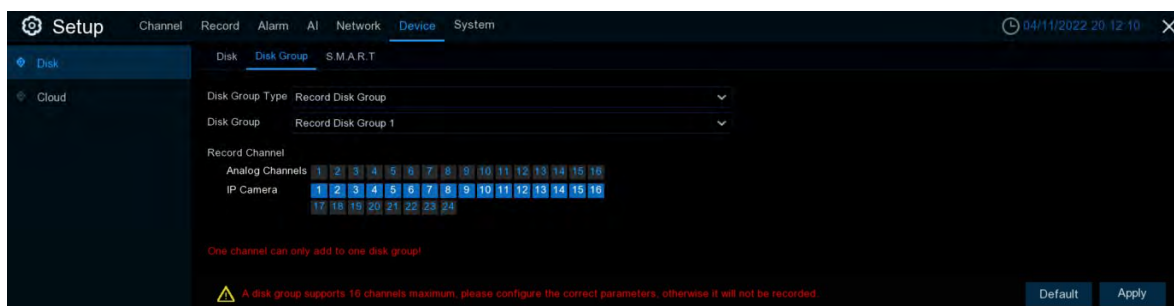
Read-write mode is the normal status for a HDD to save recording or search recording to play.

To prevent important video data from being overwritten during cyclic recording, the HDD can be set as **Read-only** mode. New recording will be not able to save into this read-only HDD. You can still search recording from this read-only HDD to play.

A **Redundant** HDD can be used to automatically backup video footage on the recording (read-write) hard drive. When a redundant HDD is set, the system can be set to record cameras in parallel to both the recording hard drive and the redundant hard drive in case of hard drive failure.

### 5.6.1.1 Disk Group

If your DVR supports to install multiple HDDs, you can configure the HDD to be different groups. HDD groups allow you to balance recordings across multiple hard drives. For example, you can record channels 1~4 to one hard drive and 5~8 to a second hard drive. This can reduce the amount of wear on the hard drives and may extend the life of the hard drives.

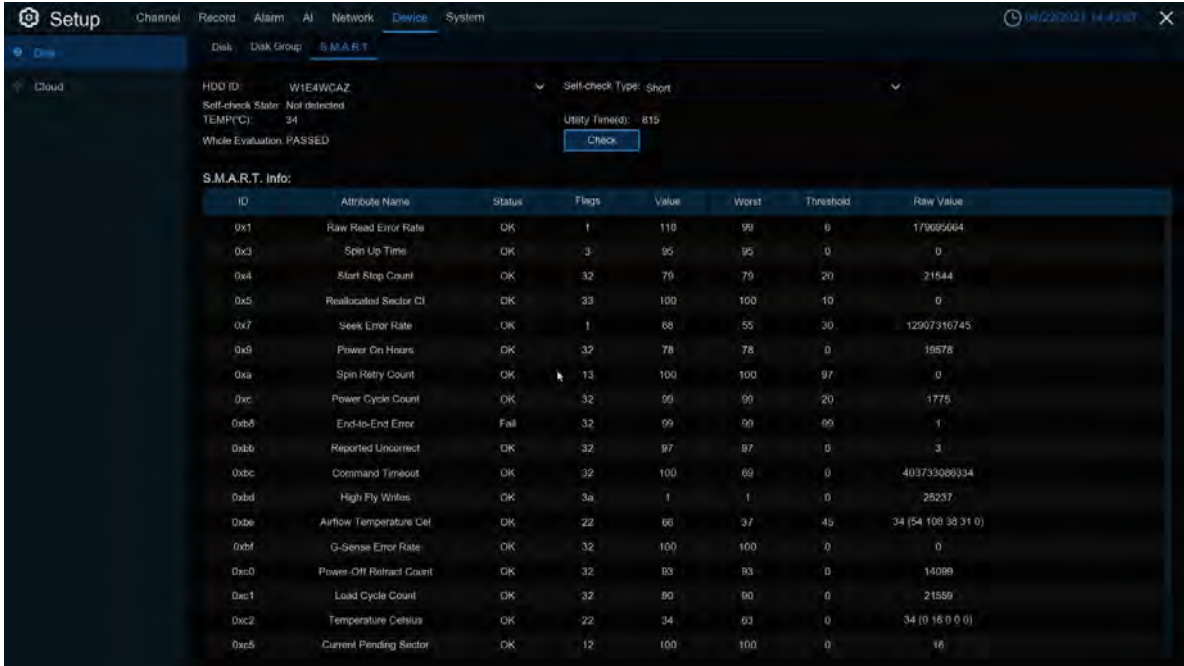

5.6.1.2 S.M.A.R.T

This function can be used to display technical information on the hard drive installed inside your DVR. You can also perform a test (there are three types available) to evaluate and detect potential drive errors.



**Self-check Type:** There are three types available:

**Short:** This test verifies major components of the hard drive such as read/write heads, electronics and internal memory.

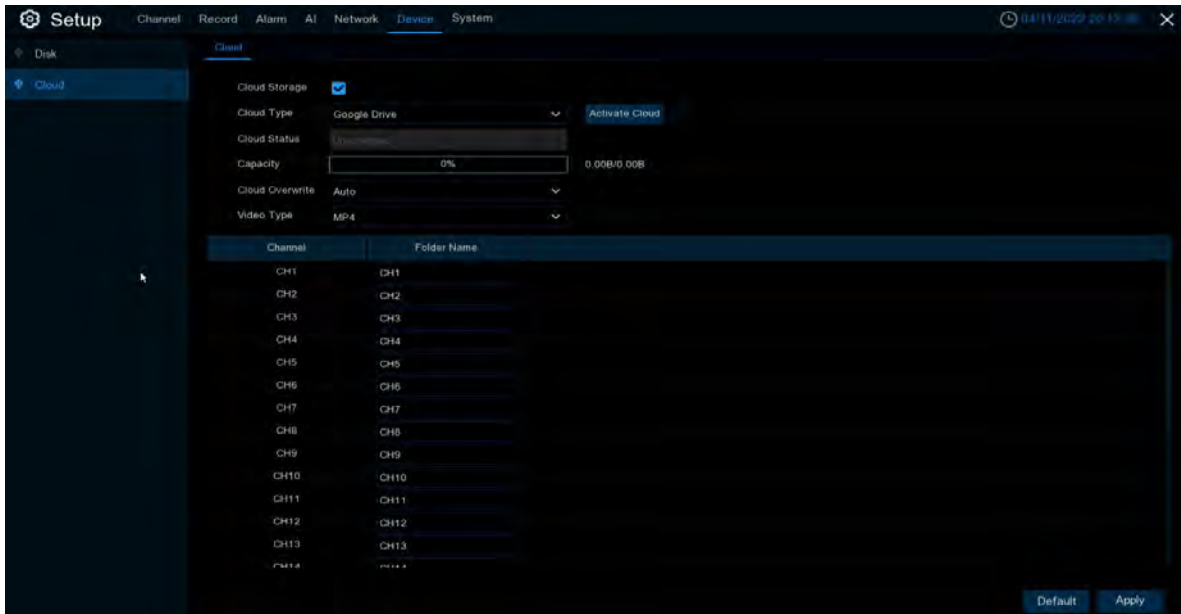
**Long:** This is a longer test that verifies the above as well as performing a surface scan to reveal problematic areas (if any) and forces bad sector relocation

**Conveyance:** This is a very quick test that verifies the mechanical parts of the hard drive are working.

**Note:** When performing the test, your DVR will continue to work normally. If you find a hard disk S.M.A.R.T error, you can continue to use the hard disk, but there is a risk of losing recorded data. It is recommended to replace the hard disk with a new one.

5.6.2 Cloud

Your DVR has the ability to upload snapshots to the cloud service via Dropbox which is a free service that allows you to easily store and share snapshots and always have them on hand when you need them.



Before activating the cloud function, we recommend that you create a Dropbox account using the same email address and password used for your DVR. Go to [www.dropbox.com](http://www.dropbox.com), nput your name, email address and password, agree to the terms & conditions then click the sign up button.

**Cloud Storage:** Check to enable the function.

**Cloud Type:** To select cloud type, Dropbox and Google Drive are optional.

**Cloud Status:** To show cloud activation status

**Capacity:** To show the remaining space of cloud storage.

**Cloud Overwrite:** Sets the Cloud storage Overwrite frequency.

**Video Type:** Sets the Video format to be uploaded to the cloud.

**Folder Name:** storage the Name of the Folder that stores videos and images on the channel

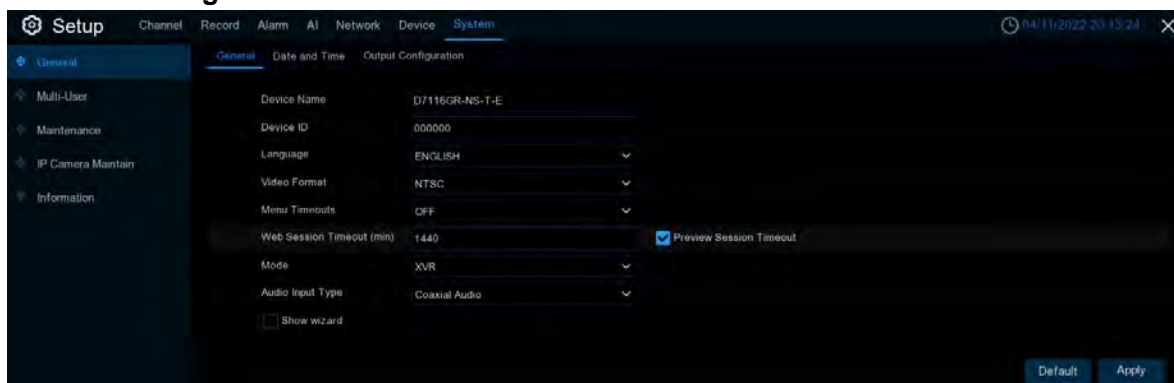
**Activate Cloud:** Click to activate the function. After a short moment, you will see a message on-screen. An activation link has been sent to your email (the email address which you had set to receive email alerts in [5.5.3.1 Email Setting](#) Check your email then click the link to activate. You will be taken to the Dropbox website. Click “Allow” to finalize the activation. Repeat these steps if you would like to enable cloud storage for the other cameras available.

## 5.7 System

Change general system information such as date, time and region, edit passwords and permissions, and more.

### 5.7.1 General

#### 5.7.1.1 General Configuration



**Device Name:** Enter the DVR name. The name can contain letters and numbers.

**Device ID:** Enter the DVR device ID. The device ID is used to identify the DVR and can only be made up of numbers. For example, two DVRs are installed in the same location, one of which has a device ID of 000000, and the other has a device ID of 111111. When you want to operate a DVR with the remote control, both DVRs may receive signals from the controller and act at the same time. If you only want to control the DVR with ID 111111, you can use the remote control to enter the device ID 111111 in the login page for further operation.

**Language:** Select the language in which you want to display the system menu. Multiple languages are available.

**Video Format:** Choose a video format that suits your region.

**Menu Timeouts:** Click the drop-down menu and select the time to exit the main menu when the DVR is idle. You can also disable this function by selecting off (password protection will be temporarily disabled)

**Web Session Timeout (min) :** Set the time to automatically log out of the web after a period of no operation when using the wed side to log in.

**Preview/Playback Session Timeout:** After enable, in the preview or playback, to avoid automatic logout

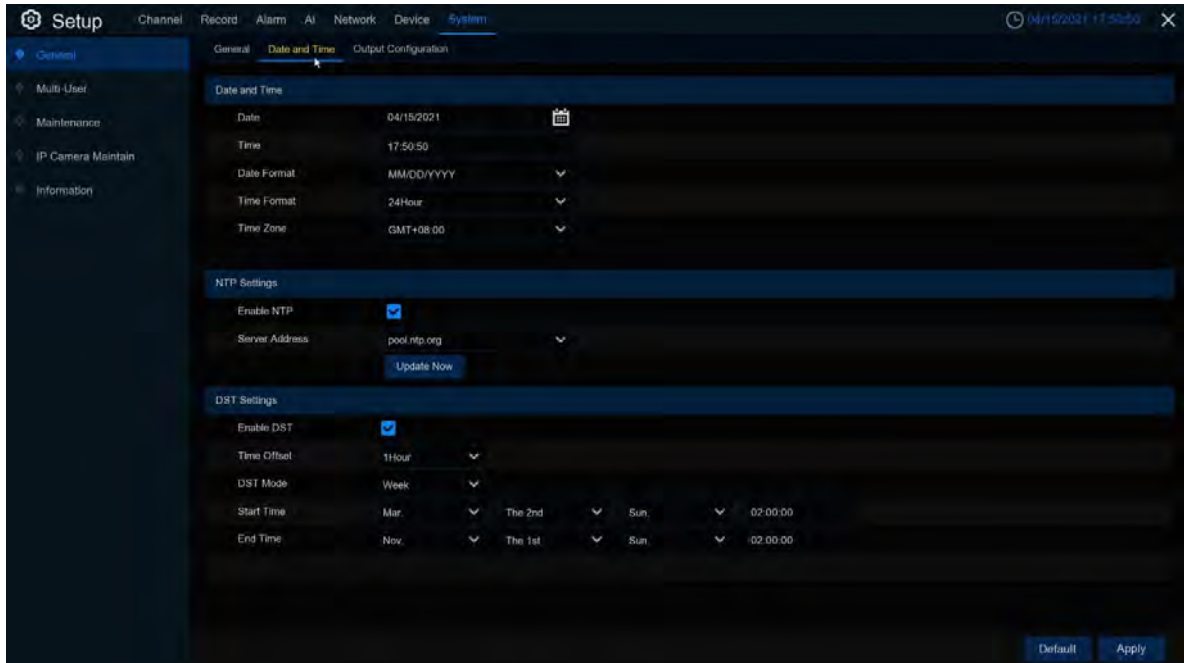

**Mode:** XVR or DVR, XVR mode will allow you to add IP cameras to the DVR. If the mode is changed from xvr to DVR, all added IP cameras will be removed.

**Audio Input Type:** Select the analog channel Input Audio source. **Base-band Audio** is used to Input the Audio source on the board. Select **Coaxial Audio** using the analog Audio input as the Audio source.

**Show Wizard:** Check this option if you want to display the startup wizard every time you open or restart a DVR

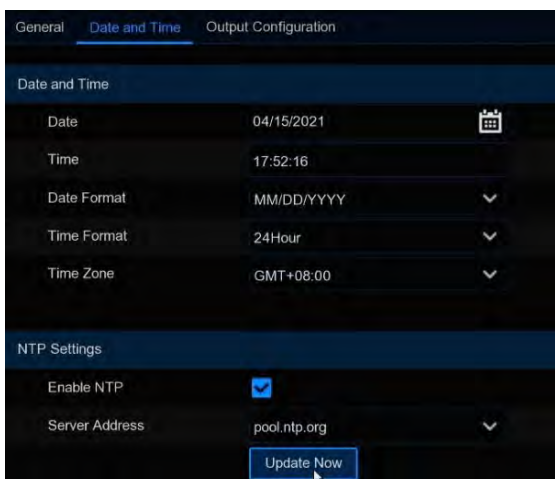

**NTP Settings:** Enable NTP: , Server Address: pool.ntp.org, with an 'Update Now' button.  
**DST Settings:** Enable DST: , Time Offset: 1Hour, DST Mode: Week, Start Time: Mar., The 2nd, Sun., 02:00:00, End Time: Nov., The 1st, Sun., 02:00:00.

**Enable DST:** If Daylight Saving applies to your time zone or region, check this option to enable.

**Time Offset:** Select the amount of time that Daylight Saving has increased by in your time zone. This refers to the difference in minutes, between Coordinated Universal Time (UTC) and the local time.

**Enable DST:** You can select how Daylight Saving starts and ends:

**Week:** Select the month, a particular day and time when Daylight Saving starts and ends. For example, 2 a.m. on the first Sunday of a particular month.

**Date:** Select the start date (click the calendar icon ) , end date and time when Daylight Saving starts and ends.

  - **account:** Login, out and switch users.
  - **recording:** Search, playback, and backup.
  - **storage:** Format hard, full, and hard disk errors.
  - **network:** Network drops, networking, networking, network errors, and network pattern changes.
4. Click **Search**.
5. Browse system log events from your search period:
  - o Video events can be played back instantly by clicking in the **Playback** column. Right-click to return to your search results.
  - o Use the **⏪ < / > ⏩** buttons in the bottom-right corner of the menu to move between pages of system log events.
6. Click **Backup** to create a backup of the system log for your search period. Please make sure your flash drive has been connected to the DVR's USB port.
7. The backup drive menu appears. Navigate to the folder you want the backup file to be saved in, then click **OK** to begin.

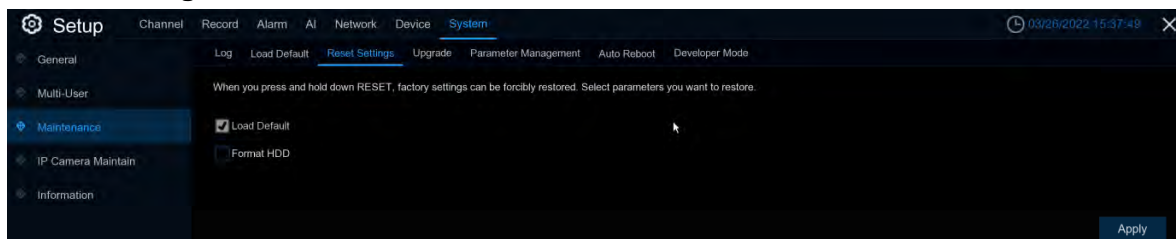

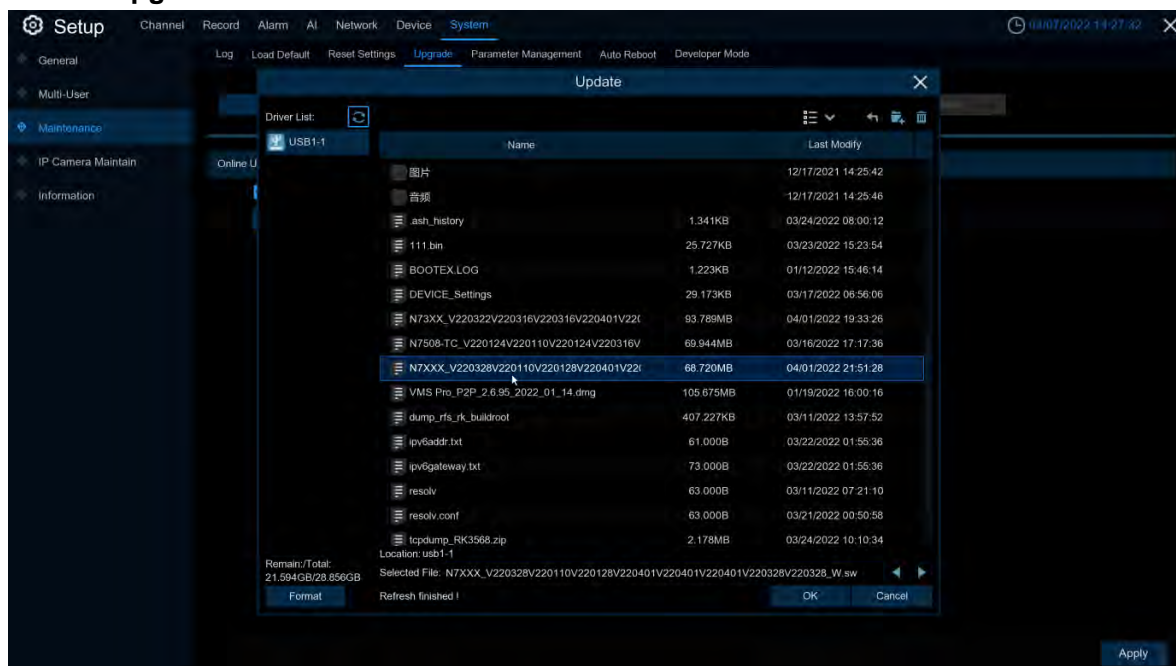

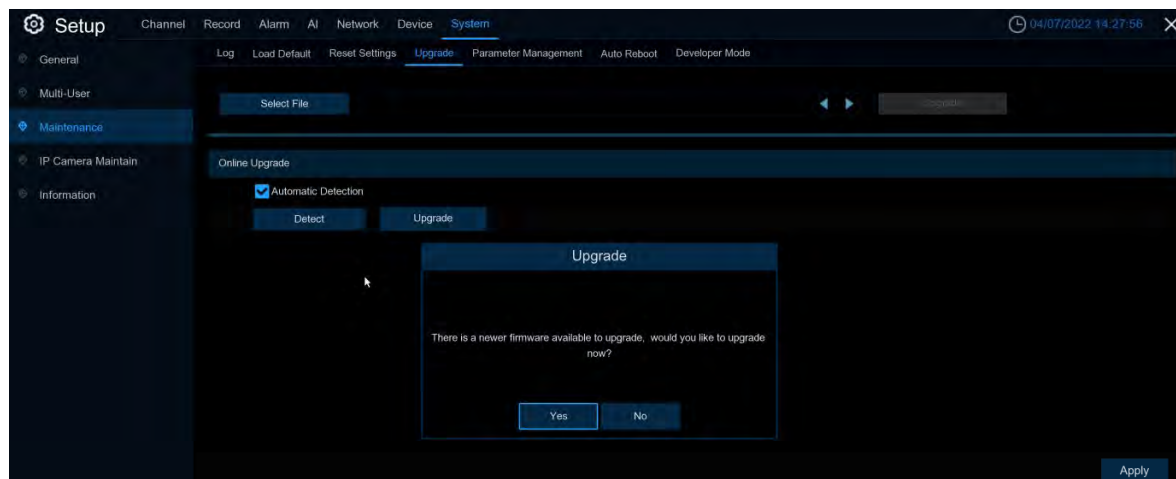
### 5.7.3.4 Upgrade

#### 5.7.3.4.1 USB Upgrade



1. Copy the firmware file (.sw file) to your USB drive, and insert the USB flash drive into the DVR's USB port.
2. Click **Select File** button to choose the firmware file in your USB flash drive, then Click **OK**.
3. Click **Upgrade** button to start system upgrade. The system upgrade will last around 5-10 minutes, please do **NOT** power off the DVR or remove the USB from DVR during firmware upgrade.

#### 5.7.3.4.2 Online upgrade



By burning the upgrade file website and the online upgrade switch parameters, you can upgrade the board end online through the network server (HTTP or FTP).

(1) When the **automatic detection** is opened, the initial power on the board will first judge whether it is automatic maintenance and restart, and if it is automatic maintenance, skip to detect whether there is a new upgrade package (judgment method: the current system time is considered automatic maintenance within 30 minutes later than the automatic maintenance time). If it is not automatic maintenance and restart, it will delay 5 minutes to check whether there is a new upgrade package. If there is, the upgrade status bar shows "online upgrade". When the user chooses this channel and click upgrade, they will download the upgrade package.

(2) When the **automatic detection** is started, there will be a new upgrade package during the operation. If there is, the upgrade status bar of the upgrade page shows "online upgrade". When the user clicks the **upgrade**, he will download the upgrade package. The detection period is a random number of 18 to 23 hours after the restart time point (including automatic maintenance). After it is obtained by random acquisition during the operation, the period will not change until the system stops running (since the upgrade cycle is 18 to 23 hours, in order to prevent excessive bandwidth from downloading the upgrade package, the first detection cycle of the upgrade will subtract 5 hours from the random value of 18 to 23 hours, 5 hours in advance, and the subsequent period)

(3) During the operation of the system, users can click on the upgrade page to check whether there is a new upgrade package. After clicking, there will be a pop-up box to prompt you to detect. After the detection, the upgrade status bar will display the results. When a new upgrade package is detected and the user clicks on the upgrade, they download the upgrade package. Note: Manual detection does not affect periodic detection

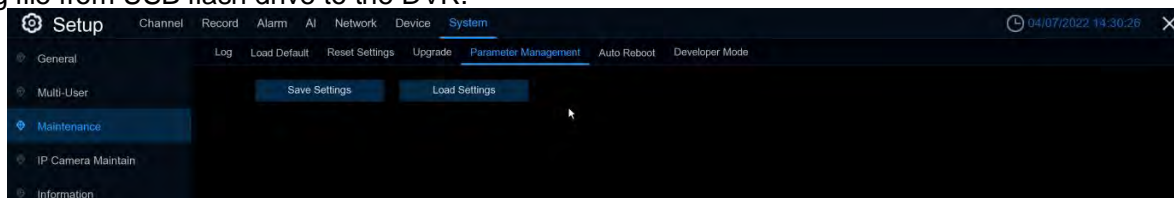
(4) When **automatic detection** is changed from open to closed, periodic detection is stopped; from closed to open, periodic detection is opened for a random number of 18 to 23 hours after this time point. And delay by 1 minute to check if there is a new upgrade package (1 minute delay is to prevent users from switching back and forth on and off)

Note: If the user turns off again during the delay process, the timing will exit, and you will no longer check for a new upgrade package. After opening again, regain)

**Note:** The Neutral program currently does not support FTP online upgrades

### 5.7.3.5 Parameter Management

You can *export* the main menu settings you have configured to a USB flash drive, or import an exported setting file from USB flash drive to the DVR.

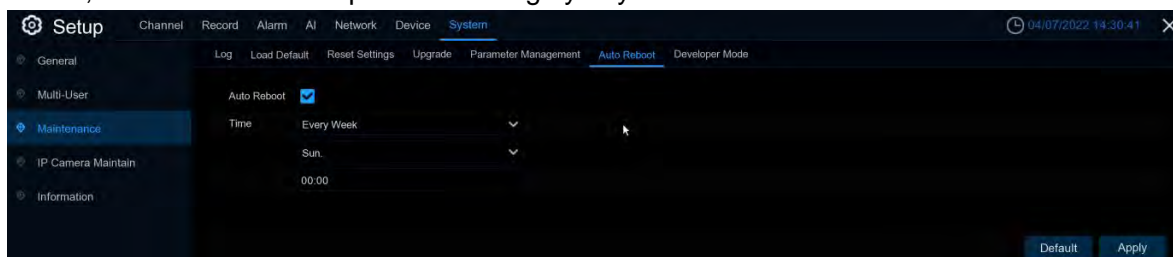

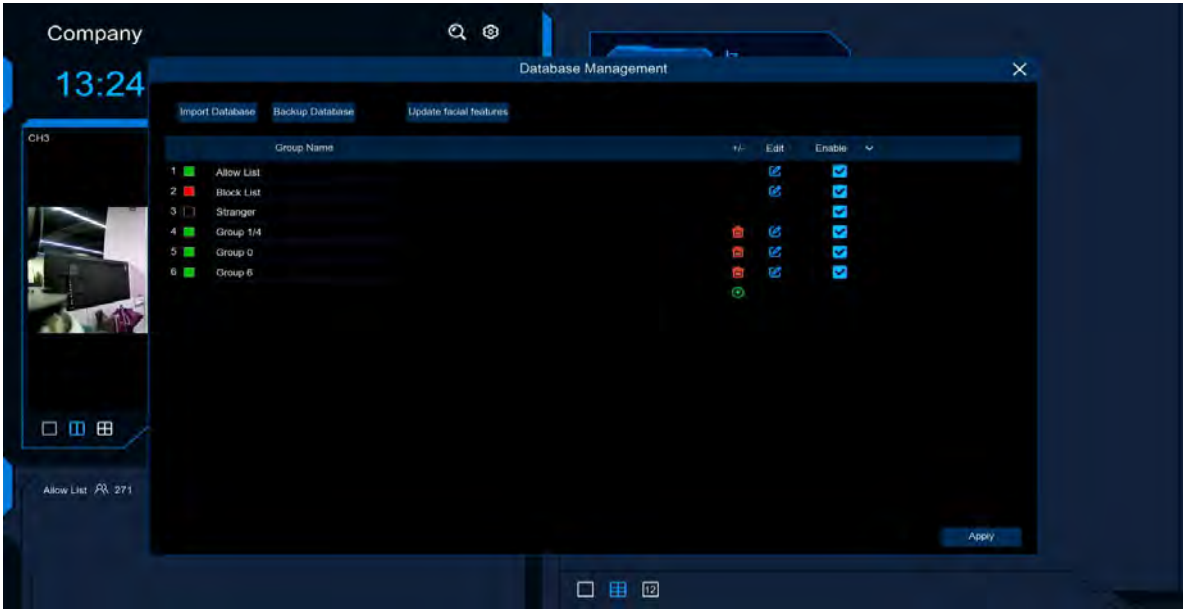

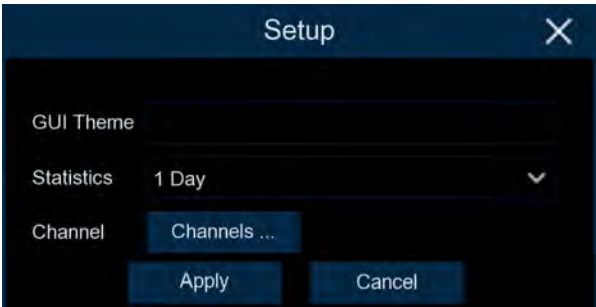

### Chapter 7 Search, Playback & Backup

The Search function gives you the ability to search for and play previously recorded videos as well as snapshots that are stored on your DVR's hard drive. You have the choice of playing video that matches your recording schedule, manual recordings or motion events only. The Backup function gives you the ability to save important events (both video and snapshots) to a USB flash drive.


#### 7.1 Using Search Function


Click  **Search** button in the Start Menu to enter search section.

For example, if the video is an hour long and you have selected Split-screens x 4, each split-screen will play for 15 minutes.




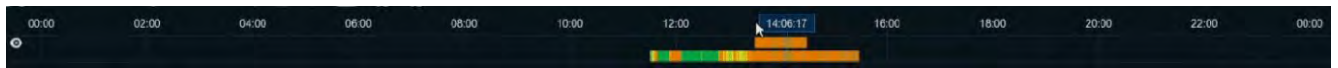

## 7.1.9.2 License plate detection

If the alarm is triggered and the video is recorded, you can view the video details or export in this interface.



**Time:** Set the time period to query the license plate detection event. Date setting can be set by clicking 

**License Plate:** Screening and query according to the license plate information.

**Fault-tolerant:** Fault tolerance rate, when set to three characters, the white list is B594SB, and also triggered when a B 734KB enters the monitoring area. That is, the detection license plate number has 0~3 characters and the database license plate number is different will be identified.

**Snapped Information:** Details of the alarm events, with the following five items:

**Channel:** Video shooting channel in the event.

**Start Time:** Start time when the event was triggered.

**End Time:** End time when the event was triggered.

**Snaped License Plate:** The license plate number obtained by the camera is captures by taking the license plate photo.


**Matched License Plate:** License plate number obtained from the database.

**Sort By:** Event videos are sorted by time.



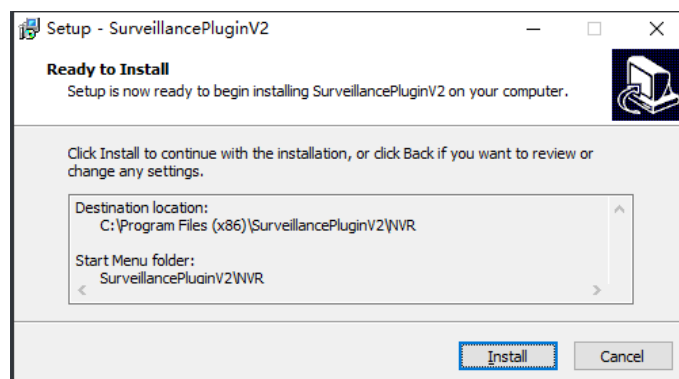
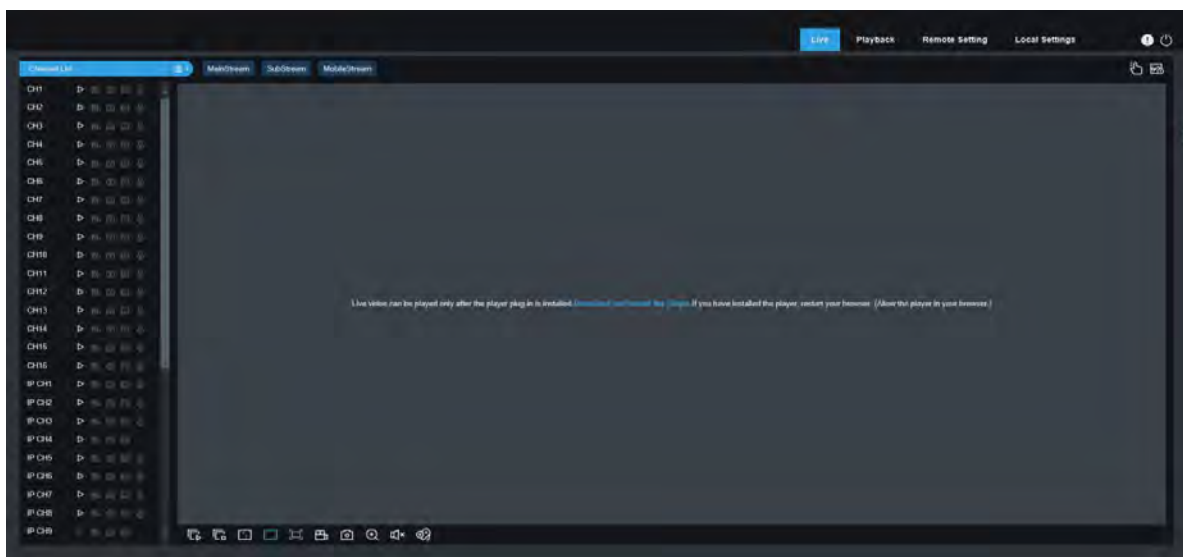
To access the Web Client, do the following:

### For IE Chrome:

1. Launch the explorer on your PC and enter the DVR IP address or DDNS domain name (Host Name) you have set on DVR in the URL box.



2. For the first time you run the web client, system will require to install the web client plugin. Click **download** to download the plugin and install to your computer.



2. After installing the plug-in, refresh the page and click Allow in the pop-up window at the bottom of the page to use the image normally.

**Note:** When using Safari/ Google/Firefox /Microsoft Edge, you don't need to download the plug-in and can directly log in to the DVR.

### 8.3 Web Client Manager

The web client supports to fully control the DVR with administrator account. Please make sure to protect your user name & password for preventing illegal login.

#### 8.3.1 Live Interface

This is the first screen that opens after you have logged in to the Web Client. Here you can open or close live preview, record video to local computer manually, take snapshots of the screens, PTZ control, color adjustment, etc.



#### 1- Channel List: Open the channel list for quick camera function

Click button to display the Channel List.

Click button to hide the Channel List.

Turn the Live video stream on/off. The button is in blue color if the live video stream is on.

Manual Recording buttons. Click to start manually recording live stream video. Click again to stop recording. Manual recordings are saved to your computer. While in recording, the button is in blue color.

Manual snapshot button. Click to save a snapshot of the current live display to your computer.

Bitrate button. Set camera to use mainstream, substream or mobile stream video settings. Mobile stream is available for IP channels only.

#### 2- Live Video Stream Options:

**Mainstream:** View all live videos using high-quality mainstream video settings.

**Substream:** View all live videos using middle-quality substream video settings.

**Mobile Stream:** View all live video using lower-quality mobile stream video settings to conserve bandwidth. Available for IP channels only.

#### 3- Main Menus:

**Live:** View live video from cameras.

**Playback:** View recorded video which is saved in DVR's HDD.

**Remote Setting:** Access functions of the DVR setting menus.

**Local Settings:** Set download locations for recordings and snapshots taken using Web Client, and choose file type for video files.





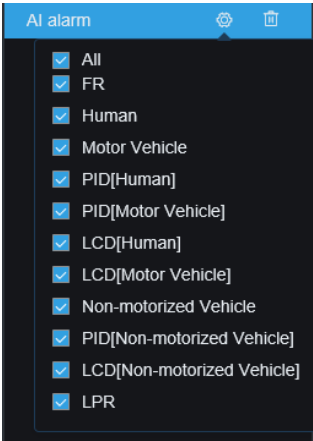

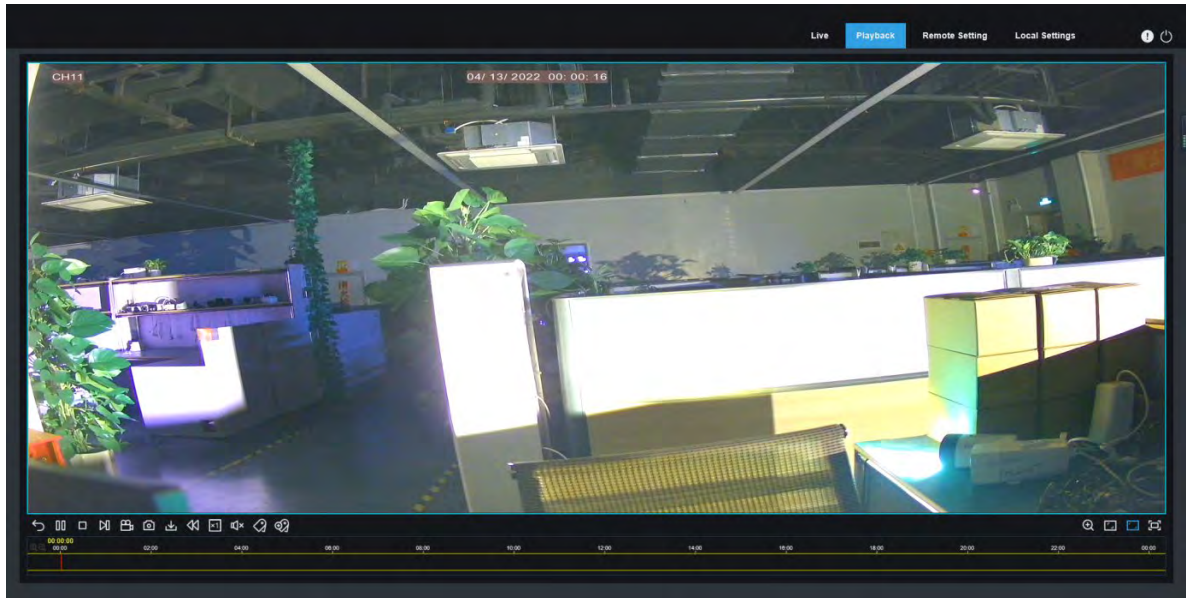

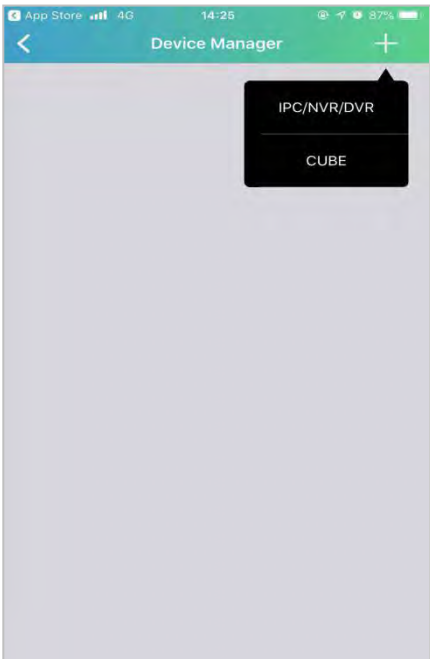
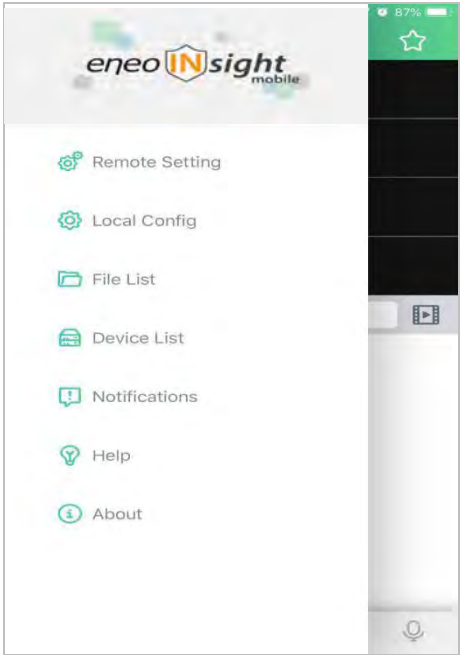
## Chapter 10 Remote Access via Mobile Devices

The DVR supports to remote access via mobile devices based on Android & iOS operating system.

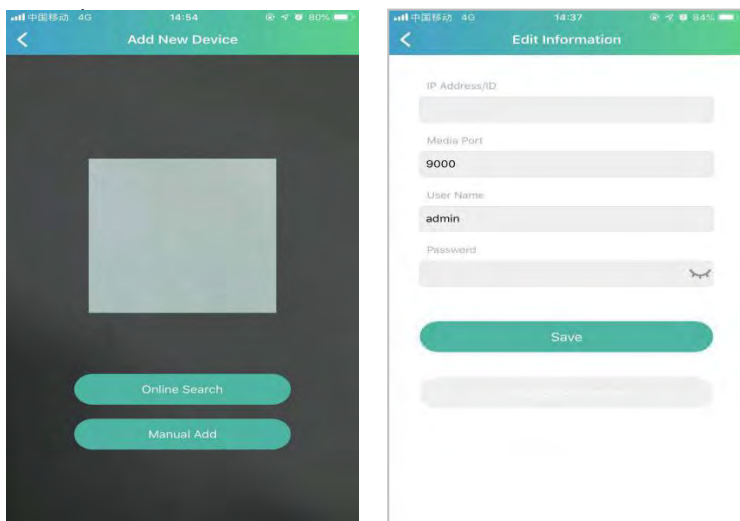
- 1) Search eneolNSight mobile from Google Play Store for android devices or App Store or iOS devices and install.

1. **Scan the QR code:** Scan the QR code to add devices.
2. **Online search:** On the same LAN as the device, search and add.

4. **Media port:** Enter the media port in the DVR network Settings.  
**User name/Password:** Enter the user name and password of the DVR.

1) After all settings are complete, click Save. When the device is well connected, the app goes to real-time display.

## Chapter 11 Appendix

### .11.1 FAQ questions

1. What should I do if the hard disk is not detected?

A: If the system does not detect the hard disk, check whether the data cable and power cord are well connected, faulty with the interface on the motherboard, or whether the hard disk is supported in the specification.

2. After changing the system password, you accidentally forget and can not enter the system?

A: When the administrator forgets the password, please contact our technician. It is recommended that users should set an easy to remember and relatively secure password (if you have security requirements, please try not to set a simple password such as 000000).

3. Why do the DVR and the camera have the normal power supply but no video signal or abnormal images and output at the monitor end?

A: Please check whether the network cable of DVR is well connected, whether the network cable is used too aging, or check whether the N system / P system selection is consistent.

4. What effects may heat dissipation have in D V R work?

Answer: The operation of DVR will produce a certain amount of heat. Please place the DVR in a safe and well ventilated place to avoid the DVR from affecting the stability and service life of the system for a long time.

5. Why can the remote control of DVR not operate, while the monitoring screen is normal and the panel buttons can be used?

Answer: If the IR signal is aligned at the front panel of the body but the remote control is still invalid, please check whether the battery in the remote control is normal and sufficient. If it is not the above problem, the remote control is broken.

6. If I put the hard drive on my PC into the DVR, can I use it?

A: If it is a hard disk that your system can support, it is important to note that the data on your hard disk will be lost once the DVR is running.

7. Can you play it back along with the video?

A: Yes, the native system can support recording while playback video recording.

8. Can you clear some video records on the DVR hard disk?

A: Considering the security of the file, you can't clear a part of the video operation, you really need to delete all the video records can choose to format the hard disk operation.

9. Why can't you enter the DVR client?

Answer: Please check whether the network connection mode configuration is correct, whether the RJ-45 interface contact is good, and then when the network login password switch is opened, please check whether your account and password correspondence are correct.

6. What can not find any recorded information when playing the video back?

A: Please check whether the data cable of the hard disk is well connected and whether the system time is being illegally adjusted. Try several times, if the above phenomenon still appears to check whether the hard disk is damaged.

7. Why can't DVR control the cloud head?

A: Please check it up:

A) Front PTZ fault.

The b) cloud head decoder is not set up, connected and installed correctly.

c) Incorrect DVR PTZ settings.

d) The cradle head decoder protocol does not match the DVR protocol.

e) The cradle head decoder address does not match the DVR address.

f) If multiple decoders are connected, the PTZ decoder AB line should add 120 resistance to achieve reflection inhibition and impedance matching. Otherwise, the cloud head control will be unstable.

1. Why doesn't dynamic detection work?

Answer: Check whether the mobile detection time and the mobile detection area setting are correct, and also check whether the sensitivity setting is too low.

13. Why doesn't the alarm work?

Answer: Check whether the alarm setting and alarm connection are correct, and whether the alarm input signal is correct.

14. Why do the buzzers keep ringing?

Answer: Check the relevant setting of the alarm, whether the mobile detection is on and detected, whether the I / O alarm is normally closed, and check the relevant hard disk alarm setting.

15. Why is the system still being recorded by sometimes pressing the "STOP" key or clicking on the "Stop recording" in the shortcut menu?

Answer: press "STOP" or click "stop video"; stop manual video can modify the video status of some time to no video, to stop the video mode to timing or manual video, and then stop the video in the above way.Or to stop recording you can set the channel status in the recording setting to close.

## **11.2 Usage Maintenance**

1. To shut down DVR, please firstly shut down the system and then turn off the power. Do not turn off the power directly or HDD data will be lost or damaged.

2. Please keep DVR away from heat sources or places.

3. Clean the internal dust regularly. Make sure the good ventilation of DVR so as to ensure the good heat dissipation.

4. Please do not hot plugging audio and video cables, or cables connected to ports like RS-232 or RS-485. Otherwise the ports will be damaged.

5. Please check the HDD cable and data cable regularly to see if they are ageing.

6. Please prevent the audio and video signals of DVR from being intervened by other electronic devices, and prevent the HDD from being damaged by static electricity and induced voltage. If the network cable is frequently plugged, it is suggested to replace connecting line regularly, or the input signal may be unstable.

7. This is a class of product. It maybe bring wireless interference in life. Under this situation, it need user to make measures.
